HONESTLY, I HATE TO TELL YOU

Overfilling and dilatation of one of the numerous little veins around the rectal orifice constitutes a pile (hemorrhoid). It is an internal pile if it is within the margin; an external pile if it is outside of the orifice. The u.s. have internal or external piles and are scarcely aware of any trouble, unless or until the pile or piles begin to bleed (internally) or become inflamed (externally). Inflammation of external piles is commonly called an "attack" of piles.

No doctor or specialist can determine whether a patient has or has not internal piles without visual examination by means of headlight and speculum. If a doctor pretends to make the diagnosis without having so examined the patient, the patient had better make a quick get-away.

I still contend this is a health column and in order to keep it so I have been considering for the past week, on the bowing green and off, how much I can say here about internal piles without suggesting symptoms. Once I said something about a more serious disease which may purport to be piles. An editor down south became alarmed, hurried to his doctor for examination, found that the trouble was piles, returned to the office in high dudgeon, and threw me and my pediculous column out of his paper.

Well, now, having cogitated the question, I have decided to mention some "misleading" features—if this should worry or alarm anyone, let him consult his physician and blame me or thank me for the suggestion.

One poor cook had done a lot of "doctoring," mostly with near-doctors, and queer-doctors, for "lumbago" before an accident in his home brought him under the observation of an "ordinary" doctor in his neighborhood, who diagnosed his "lumbago," gave the internal piles ambulant treatment, and cured the "lumbago."

Although feminine customers are not so credulous today as their untutored mothers and grandmothers were, the constant backache and vague sense of pressure or congestion in the pelvic region, due to internal piles, may convince the unhappy creature that she has "female weakness" of one sort or another.

For years a wisecrack had been monkeying with his diet and dosing himself with antacids for what he called an "ulcer," gradually losing weight and acquiring a careworn appearance beyond his years. One day he was frightened by bleeding from the bowel. This sent him to a doctor. The doctor, fortunately, was skilled in modern methods. He injected the bleeding pile. The single injection stopped the bleeding and cured the peptic "ulcer." The stomach or digestive troubles the man had attributed to "ulcer" were evidently reflex symptoms of internal piles.

The only complaint in many instances is anemia, from frequent or constant bleeding of internal piles. The bleeding is not noticed by the patient because the blood darkens in the intestine and is not recognized as blood in the dejecta. This anemia may become severe and, of course, it does not respond to

iron, liver, B12 or other treatment unless the internal pile or piles be found by careful examination with headlight and speculum (proctoscope) and obliterated by surgery or by injection. Bear in mind that in such cases there may be no other symptoms or indication of internal piles than the persistent anemia and daily loss of a small amount of blood into the bowel may continue for a long time unnoticed.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
Dentist Laughs
My gums seem to be soft and shrinking away from the teeth. I am 24. When I asked the dentist if more milk, tomato juice, and fresh fruit juice would help, he laughed at me and said it is too late, that I am too old, nothing can help now, as I stopped growing and developing at the age of 21 years. (Mrs. M. W.)

Answer—Chemical composition of the gums, bones, teeth, organs, in fact of the entire body, changes constantly from birth to death, and your present age has nothing to do with it. Let the dentist laugh while you consult a physician. I can assure you that more milk and milk products (cheese, particularly), fresh fruit or fruit juice and tomato or tomato juice in your diet will at least retard progress of the degeneration and tend to prolong the useful life of gums, teeth, and body.

Plan To Settle A-Strike Offered

Oak Ridge, Tenn. — (U.P.) — Federal mediators Saturday night offered a "basis for settlement" plan to halt some 4,500 atomic production workers from a proposed walkout over a long and bitter wage dispute.

Both labor and management immediately labelled the plan "unsatisfactory" but "maybe acceptable."

The workers, 3,500 at Oak Ridge, and 1,000 at Paducah, produce the nation's entire sup-

ply of Uranium-235, an ingredient necessary in the manufacture of atomic and nuclear weapons.

The mediators, seeking to stave off a threatened strike at plants in Oak Ridge and Paducah, Ky., threatened "unless something gives by daylight," did not reveal the proposal. But it was the first hint in the nine-month old dispute of a possible settlement.
