

California Railroad To Strike on Friday

Cleveland — (U.P.) — Engineers on the Northwest Pacific railroad, running between Tiburon and Eureka, Calif., scheduled a strike today, effective at 12:01 a.m. (PST) this Friday.

Grand Chief Engineer Guy L. Brown of the BLE announced the strike through the union's Cleveland headquarters. Brown himself now is in the Canadian Northwest.

Brown said the union has long been negotiating working rule grievances for the past year, with the mediation board making two fruitless attempts to settle the dispute. He said Northwest Pacific's parent line, Southern Pacific, already has the ruler changes in effect.

E. H. Hedrick Elected To SOHS Directorate

E. H. Hedrick, superintendent of Medford schools, was elected a director of the Southern Oregon Historical Society, Inc., at the organization's monthly meeting last night. Hedrick's election fills the board vacancy caused by the recent death of Mrs. Frances Cochran.

The curator, Mrs. Myrtle P. Lee reported that visitation, at the Jacksonville Museum, which is administered by the society, continues at a heavy rate, 2,081 having registered there in October. Average monthly visitation since opening of the museum has been 3,258, and the daily average 109.

Winter visitation hours at the museum are from 1 to 5 p.m., weekdays and noon to 5 p.m., on Sundays.

Electric Power From Atom Expected Soon

Pasadena, Calif. — (U.P.) — Lewis L. Strauss, chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, today foresaw atomic energy as a practical source of electrical power in "only 10 years . . . or perhaps not so long."

"There are a number of ideas and designs for obtaining electrical power from atom fission," the retired admiral said last night in a speech before the Catholic Press Council's "banquet of the year."

He said the ideas and designs would be developed with the aim that when we have reached the point where coal and oil are scarcer and more expensive, they will be able to supplement them.

"We are just at the small beginning of trying to apply the great energy of atomic reaction," Strauss said.

Nervous Bandit Takes \$25,158 From Bank Boss

Miami Beach — (U.P.) — A nervous bandit forced the manager of the Chase Federal Savings and Loan Association to go from window to window collecting money today and escaped with \$25,158 in cash.

Manager Robert Swick said the loss was insured.

Oregon Mesabi Timber Tract Sale Revealed

Seattle — (U.P.) — Sale of more than 1,000,000 board feet of timber in Lincoln county, Ore., has been concluded here by William E. Boeing, founder of Boeing Airplane Co.

Blyth and Co., national investment house, said it had purchased the capital stock of Boeing's Oregon Mesabi Co., which owns the timber. The purchase price was reported to be between \$12,000,000 and \$15,000,000.

Blyth spokesmen said their company plans to sell the stock to the Georgia-Pacific Plywood Co., owner of considerable timber adjacent to the Oregon Mesabi tract.

The sale by Blyth would make Georgia-Pacific the owner of one of the largest private timber stands in the United States and give it enough timber to be logged "forever" on a sustained-yield basis.

Einstein Would Be Plumber or Peddler

New York — (U.P.) — Dr. Albert Einstein said today if he were younger he would become "a plumber or a peddler" because of the situation facing scientists in this country now.

In a letter published in the Reporter magazine, Dr. Einstein said he would choose such a career "in the hope to find that modest degree of independence still available under present circumstances."

Dr. Einstein's letter was in answer to a request by the magazine for his comment on a series of articles in the Reporter discussing the state of American science.

Plane Crew Praised In Belly Landing

Chicago — (U.P.) — The 40 passengers of a crippled American Airline Convair today praised the pilot and crew for keeping them calm while struggling to skid the plane to a safe belly landing.

Capt. Hugh C. Barron, Tulsa, Okla., brought the twin-engine plane down on its nose and left wheels at Glenview Naval Air Station yesterday after circling 68 minutes in an effort to free the right landing gear.

Earthquake Rocks Northern California

Ukiah, Calif. — (U.P.) — A sharp earthquake shook parts of Mendocino and Lake counties in Northern California today. First reports indicated there was no serious damage.

The tremor was felt here and at Lakeport about 10:07 a.m. (PST). Ukiah residents flooded newspaper and police switchboards with phone calls reporting the shake.

Highway Delegates Will Hear Reports

Seattle — (U.P.) — A full day of committee reports was in store today for more than 800 delegates attending the 40th annual meeting of the American Association of State Highway Officials here.

Francis V. Du Pont told delegates yesterday he would resign early in January as U. S. commissioner of public roads to devote full time to President Eisenhower's \$50,000,000 highway program.

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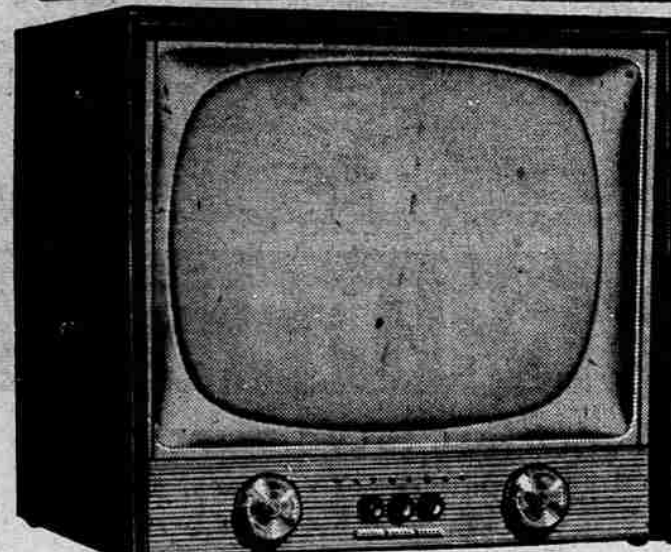
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
