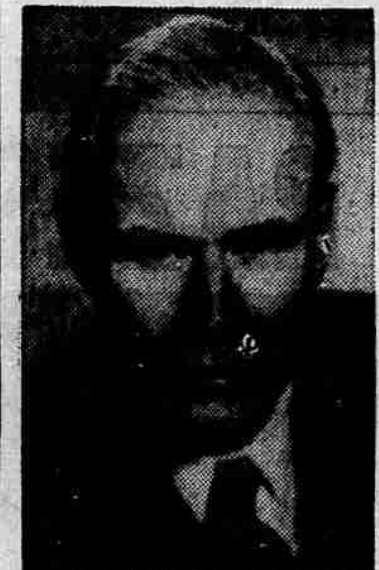

he speaks in Medford Thursday, November 11, at the YMCA. The talk is set for 7:30 p.m. and will be followed by a discussion period.

Dr. Capper-Johnson's talk here is being sponsored by Medford Council of Church Women and the YMCA. He will discuss the means by which individual citizens can support the UN.

The speaker, professor of history and international relations at Lewis and Clark college, has lived and traveled in Europe. A graduate of Oxford college, England, his native country, Mr. Capper-Johnson has organized a number of international conferences and societies devoted to world affairs and has carried out governmental missions.

He was one of the delegates to the League of Nations conference of 1936 on security on peaceful change.

Dr. Capper-Johnson taught at Syracuse and Rochester universities and Carleton college before coming to Lewis and Clark.

Friday Dr. Capper-Johnson will speak for a meeting of college student leaders to be held at Southern Oregon college, Ashland, and in the evening for a meeting in Grants Pass. Saturday and Sunday he will fill speaking engagements in the Klamath Falls area.
