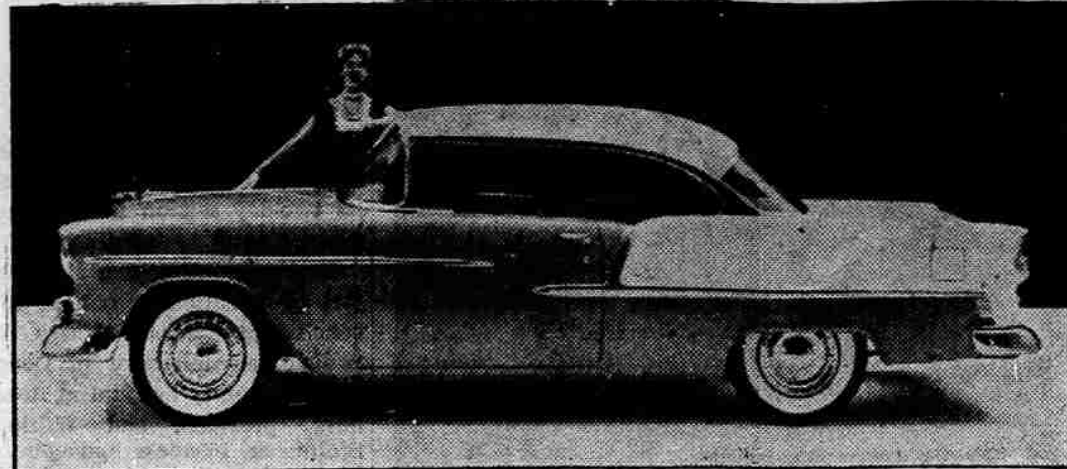

Brooks Scanlon Signs
No Wage Boost Pact

Bend—(U.P.)—Brooks Scanlon, Inc., announced yesterday it has signed a no wage increase agreement with the International Woodworkers of America (CIO). The contract expires April 1, 1956. Negotiations were started early this year, but were interrupted by the three-month lumber strike this summer.

Jack E. Chambers, local business agent for the union, said the major contract change was the substitution of a maintenance shop for the union shop. Under this provision, an employee is not required to join the union.

Chambers said the agreement covers only the firm's millworkers.

Retarded Children
Program Explained
Before Week Opens

Jackson county's role in aiding retarded children was explained today by Mrs. Robert Minear in advance of national retarded children's week, Nov. 14 to 23. Mrs. Minear is general chairman of study groups for parents of the mentally retarded.

Four such groups, with 30 families participating, meet in the county each month to study child growth and development of the mentally retarded. They were formed last year through the Jackson County Public Health association.

Professional Aid

The groups have the professional consultation of Francis Kline, director of special education in Ashland; Karl Hayes, teacher of the pilot school in Phoenix; Miss Dorothy Collard, supervisor of nursing, Jackson county Public Health department; and Miss Mary Vandenberg, psychiatric social worker.

There are an estimated 5,000 mentally retarded children in Oregon public schools, not including those at Fairview home, Mrs. Minear reported. Many more are cared for in homes. About 2 per cent of the population is estimated to be "institution cases," she said. About 500 children from the county are in Fairview home.

Aim Told

Aim of the national retarded children's week is to enlighten the general public, it was said, both in recognizing the scope of the problem and in understanding that proper education of the retarded results in many more happy and productive individuals.

Phoenix—An open house and program will be held at the Phoenix High school at 8 p.m. Friday in observance of American Education week, it was announced today by Vice-Principal William E. Ruck.

A concert by the band and chorus will be presented, and after this all high school rooms will be open for inspection by parents. Teachers will be in their rooms to meet with those attending.

Patrons of the district, and other interested valley residents, will be welcome, Ruck said.

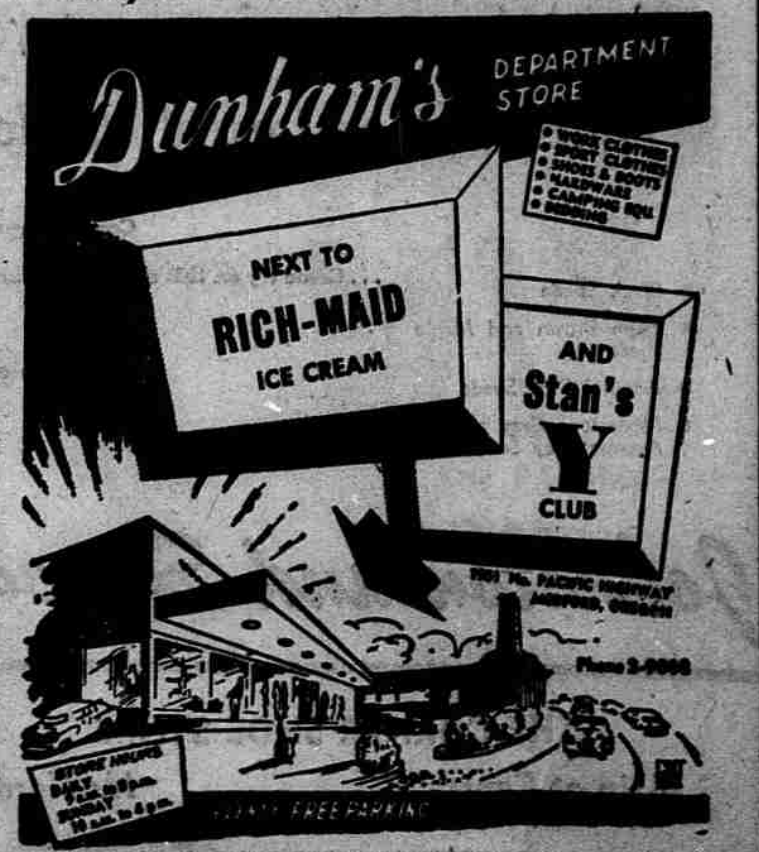

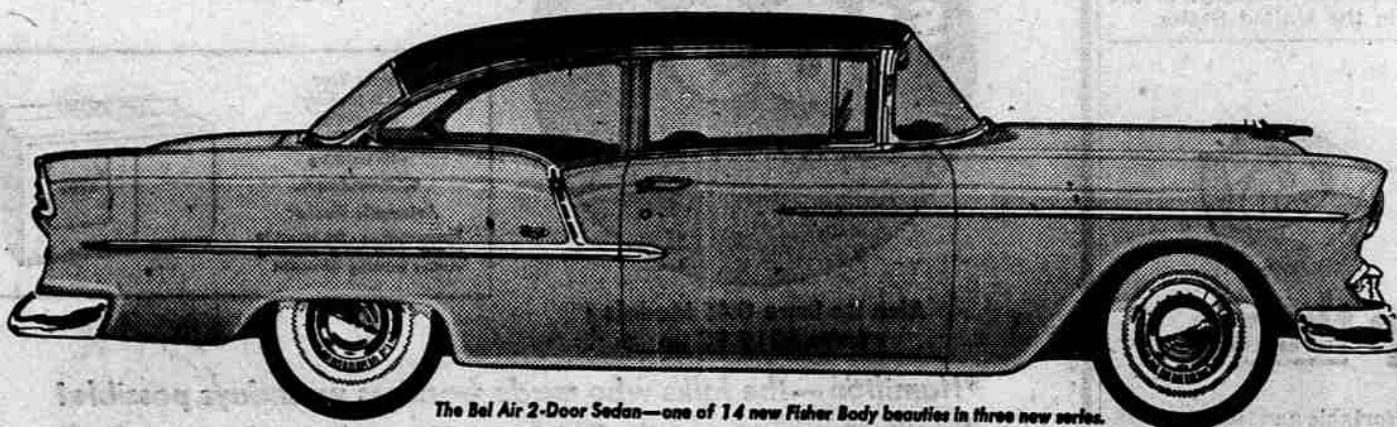
