**GOP 'Blunders'
Said Reason for
Loss of House**

Washington — (U.P.) — Rep. Usher L. Burdick (R-N.D.), said today administration "blunders" caused the Republicans to lose control of the House in the Nov. 2 elections.

"All the mistakes cannot be catalogued in a short report," Burdick said in a weekly newsletter, "but generally the Republicans did about everything they could do to drive the voters away from them. The result must necessarily follow that many Republicans who did not deserve defeat were defeated. The administration defeated them."

Burdick said the major "mistake" was the administration's flexible farm price support plan. Next, he said, "promises made to labor were not kept."

Third on Burdick's list was what he termed "the atomic energy give-away program to private interests." He cited also the "giveaway" foreign aid program which he said the GOP took over from the Democrats. It probably will continue "until the United States itself will be a fertile field for Communism," Burdick added.
