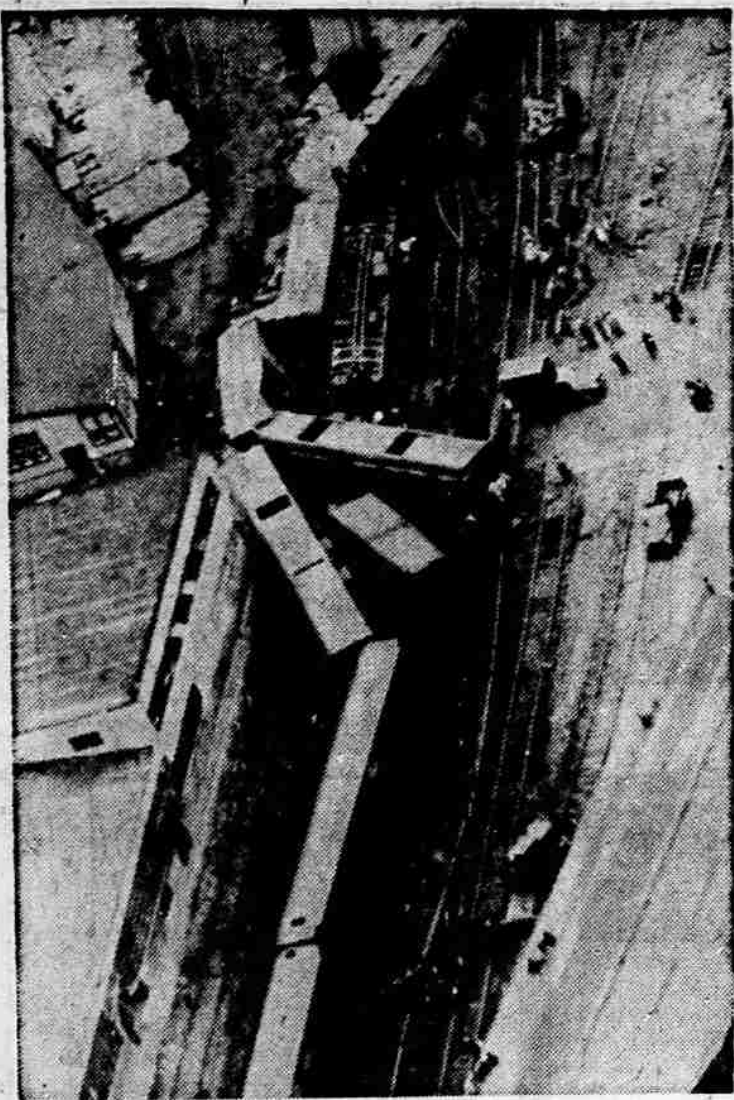

Heifer Sets Up House In Uncompleted Sewer

Decatur, Ill. — (U.P.) — A 500-pound heifer named Stuffy set up housekeeping in a sewer Saturday, and all efforts to evict her failed.

Rescuers at first thought Stuffy was a steer, but her owner said the animal is a female, and contrary to that.

Thomas Gallagher, superintendent of the uncompleted sewer project, called off attempts to dislodge Stuffy until Monday, when a full work crew will be available.

Happy In Sewer

Gallagher said Stuffy seems happy in the sewer and has plenty of hay and water for the week end. The sewer pipe is four feet in diameter so there is enough room for Stuffy to turn around in.

Stuffy, all 500 well-fed pounds of her, wandered into the end of the sewer about a mile and a half west of here Friday. She was discovered meandering along a half-mile stretch of the newly-installed pipe by construction workers.

The red and white heifer apparently was contented until "rescue" operations began.

Armed with pitchforks, Robert and James Spotes were the first to tackle the problem. But Stuffy bowled them over, and they retreated with haste.

A little later, Paul Morgan of Dalton City climbed down into the sewer. Morgan, who thought Stuffy was a little fellow, met the beefy animal head-on. That was enough for him.

Allergic To People

Another trip into the damp sewer this morning revealed that Stuffy is allergic to people and has a violent distaste for flashlights.

She apparently wants to live like a mole.

Meanwhile, Ernest Florian, Stuffy's owner, rounded up the rest of his herd to prevent them from straying in after Stuffy.

The open end of the sewer lies in an excavation on Florian's pasture.

Gallagher could not explain how Stuffy knocked over an obstruction placed at the end of the sewer to prevent just such a problem from arising.

Reds Refuse Any Interviews With Indochina Refugees

Saigon, Indochina — (U.P.) — Communist authorities in North Viet Nam have refused to allow an international investigating team to talk with the thousands of refugees fleeing Red persecution, it was reported here Saturday.

The team was sent to the Tra-Ly Rice delta area near Hai-phong by the Geneva Cease-Fire commission after the French received reports thousands of Catholic and Buddhist refugees were trying to escape from Viet Nam by sea.

Shiphord of refugees brought to Saigon aboard the French aircraft carrier Bois Belleau Friday said many refugees drowned when heavy seas swamped the rafts, sampans and fishing boats with which they were trying to reach French warships.

The seven French ships in the area were reported to have returned after Viet Minh authorities refused them permission to steam close to shore to pick up the refugees. Several thousand refugees were reported still in great danger on crumbling sandbanks where they were stranded.

Mexican Newsmen Hires Bodyguards

Tijuana, Mex. — (U.P.) — Newspaper editor Jose Garduno Bustamante said Saturday he had hired two bodyguards as protection against possible murder as an aftermath to the mass Mexican army arrest of 27 police detectives connected with a \$9,000 shakedown.

Bustamante, whose editorials in Las Noticias touched off the arrests here Thursday, said he received a telephone call which warned he would be killed if he continued his article.

The fiery editor said his paper Saturday would contain a second article about the arrests as well as an editorial.

Bustamante was threatened as Ramon Zamora Manjarrez, police chief in nearby Hemisillo, was suspended for allegedly taking \$2,000 in jewelry stolen from the Los Angeles home of Oden M. Bobo. Five of the 27 detectives have been formally charged with taking \$9,000 of the loot from confessed robber Raul Casares, who had been jailed in Mexico City with two accomplices.

Mrs. C. C. Corum, president of the Council, presided at the Wednesday meeting. Mrs. Corum and Mrs. Stanley Phillips are cochairmen of the observance for the women's group. The Rev. Thomas McCamant, Congregational, the Rev. Clynton Crisman, Friends, and the Rev. George R. V. Bolster, St. Mark's, are the ministers in charge for the association.
