

German Police Launch Intensive Search for Killer

Dusseldorf, Germany — (U.P.) — Terror stalked West Germany today. The nation's entire police force was alerted to search for "The Beast of the Autobahn," who is charged with 20 unsolved sex slayings of women along the 1300 miles of Germany's Hitler-built super-highway.

Roadblocks bristling with machine guns were set up along the four-lane ribbons of concrete, and police were ordered to shoot any motorist who refuses to obey their orders to halt. 20th Victim Found

The extraordinary measures were put into effect after the body of the "beast's" 20th victim, an attractive blonde girl, was found yesterday behind a clump of bushes near the West German capital at Bonn.

German authorities believe a single maniacal killer is responsible for the series of 20 deaths that have plagued the super-highway since 1947.

Trademark Always Same

In every instance the killer's trademark has been the same: his victim's shoes either have been removed and are missing, or have been removed and placed neatly beside the body.

It was the same with yesterday's victim. She was fully clothed except for her missing shoes. Her identity has not yet been established.

First Degree Murder Charged To Youth

Hillsboro—(U.P.)—A first degree murder information was filed yesterday against Jerry Eugene Dodele in connection with the slaying of Peter Ribbers, 65-year-old Timber, Ore., railroad machinist.

District Judge Glen Heiber continued the arraignment indefinitely in order to give the youth time to obtain an attorney. Dodele was being held without bond in the juvenile ward of the Washington county jail here.

District Attorney James Gardner said he planned to present the case to the grand jury when it convenes Nov. 24.

Dodele was arrested in Portland early Sunday morning. He signed a confession admitting that he shot Ribbers last Thursday night when the elderly man returned to his home while Dodele was attempting to burglarize it.

Korean War Hero On Trial by Army

Augusta, Ga.—(U.P.)—A Korean war hero went on trial before a general court-martial today on charges he ordered one Army trainee strung up by his ankles and "sand baths" for two others.

The defendant, 2nd Lt. Charles C. Anderson, 24, of St. Louis, was a training officer at the Camp Gordon replacement center, when the alleged incidents occurred.

He is accused also of ordering one trainee to do "pushups and squat jump" until he lay apparently exhausted on the ground.

Maj. William B. Crane defended Anderson, an enlisted hero of the Korean war who graduated recently from Officers Candidate school at Ft. Benning, Ga. The prosecuting officer was Maj. Winchester Kelso. Lt. Col. James Healey of Third Army headquarters, Ft. Monmouth, Atlanta, presided.

Premier Mendes-France Arrives in Ottawa

Ottawa — (U.P.) — French Premier Pierre Mendes-France arrived here from Montreal today for top level conferences with Canadian government officials before proceeding to Washington for talks with President Eisenhower.

Mendes-France leaves for Washington tomorrow.

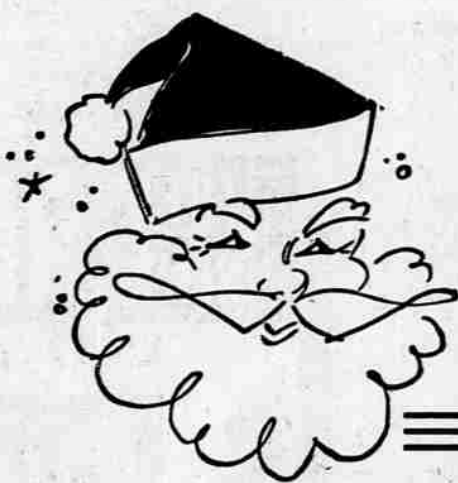

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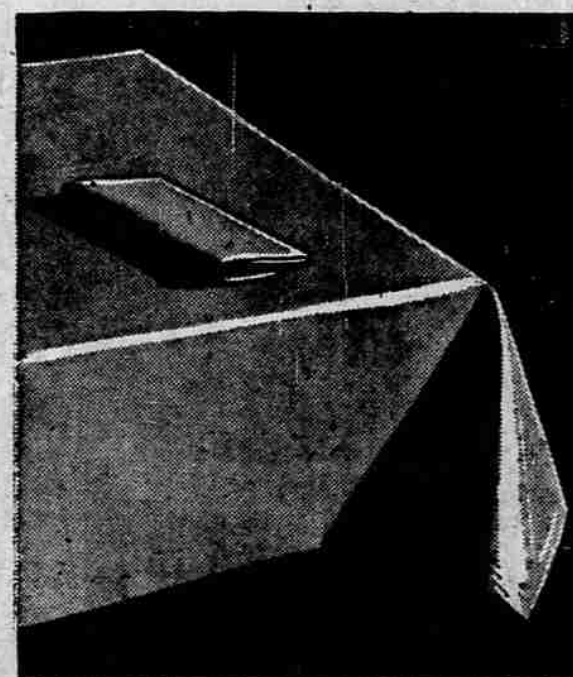
