ARE WE GOING NAMBY-PAMBY?

Old timers will remember Prof. Elie Metchnikoff's discovery of the way to prolong life: Take daily about two glasses of skimmed milk which has been boiled, rapidly cooled to a 70 to 80 degrees temperature and sown with Bulgarian lactic bacillus culture and allowed to ferment, sour or curdle in a warm place for several hours, say, over night.

Unfortunately Elie didn't live long enough to see all the old customers quit Bulgarian milk and go for Acidophilus milk. He turned up his toes in 1916 at the tender age of 71.

Whenever I hear of a good man taking such premature leave, I wonder how much longer he might have stuck around had he taken his daily ration of Ca, D, P, I, Thiamin, and Riboflavin as suggested in the pamphlet Young Folks and Old Folks, available on written, signed request if you provide a stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Why, I even wish I could have buttonholed him on the bowling green or at the club and convinced him of the importance of rolling six somersaults every morning and doing the belly breathing exercise two or three times every day.

Judging from the queries of people who write to me, Acidophilus milk, yogurt and other sour milk products no longer stir the imagination of the American public. More and more people today seem to understand that lactic acid milk, sour milk, buttermilk, cultured milk (whole or skimmed or separator milk), whether produced by nature, by sowing with plain Lactobacillus, Acidophilus, Bulgarian or other strain of milk souring germ, is just sour milk.

Sour milk is a healthful drink or food, under whatever name, if you like it.

The lactic bacilli which are naturally or normally present in fresh, pure, sweet milk and, by their multiplication and their fermentation of sugar in the in-

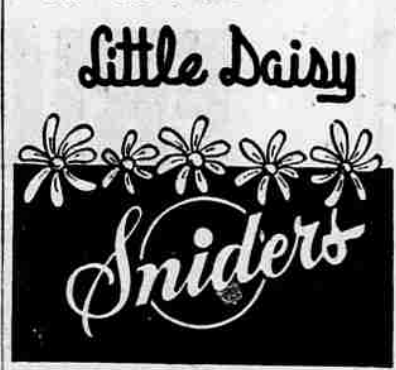
testine, producing lactic acid there, and maintaining a slightly acid reaction of the contents of the intestine, which discourages the multiplication of pathogenic (disease-producing) germs. All this is physiological and conducive to health, but it is silly to imagine the lactic bacillus 'fights' or 'destroys' harmful germs.

Metchnikoff's belief that the consumption of sour milk products by the Bulgarian and other Balkan people prolonged life may have had a grain of truth which the great bacteriologist himself did not recognize, but which, because of our newer knowledge of nutrition, we believe may account for the beneficial effects of eating or drinking sour milk products. It is this: Every one of these products is an excellent source of calcium. Furthermore, an acid reaction in the intestine favors assimilation of food calcium. And by now students of the question ought to have at least a suspicion that calcium deficiency may have

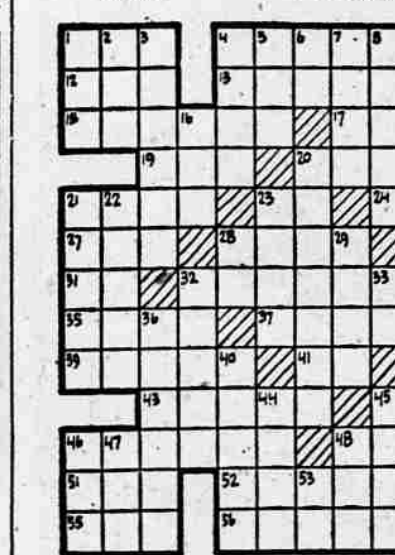
QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

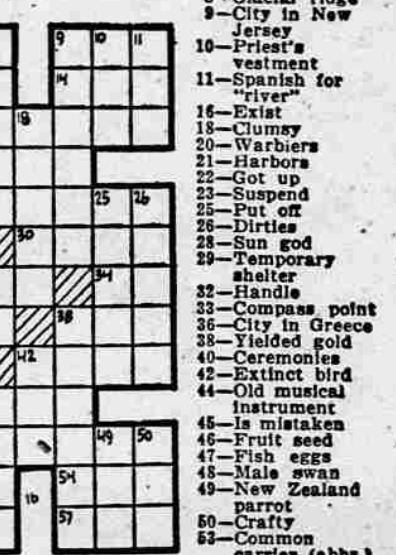

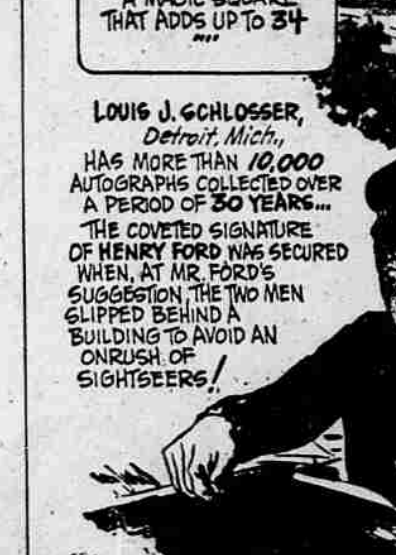
