Colorado Springs Taking Construction Of New Air Force Academy in Stride

Editor's Note: What happens to a quiet resort city when the U.S. Air Force lands in its back yard with a \$125,000,000 "West Point" academy? A boom, naturally. But at Colorado Springs the boom is unfolding so quietly you can hardly hear it.

—Colorado Springs is a boom town in slow motion. As boom towns go, it is probably better that way.

Businessmen in this picturesque resort nestled at the foot of Pike's Peak were never more optimistic. But there has been nothing remotely like hysteria since the Air Force announced it was locating its \$125,000,000 academy at Colorado Springs.

For one thing, the building of the academy will stretch out over the next four years. Also, Colorado Springs has always been basically a tourist center and it intends to stay that way.

"People from out of town are actually a little put out at us be-

cause we're not more enthusiastic," Clayton Banta, secretary-manager of the Chamber of Commerce, said. "But the truth is, we've been living with the academy for years."

Long Campaign

Selection of Colorado Springs as the academy site climaxed a long campaign by local businessmen, including many trips to Washington to "sell" their city to the Air Force. When they finally won their case last summer, they took the news in stride.
