Burly Negro Admits Abducting Girl; Detained in Jail

Rupert, Idaho—(U.P.)—A husky, 58-year-old Negro, who police said admitting abducting the 16-year-old daughter of a Rupert farm laborer Tuesday night, was held without bond in the Minidoka county jail today.

Officers said the 221-pound, alleged kidnaper was booked as Bill Harris, who went by the alias of Leo Harris and also was known locally as Leo Brown.

Harris was arraigned Wednesday night before Rupert Justice of the Peace Frank Friesen, who returned him to the county jail pending the setting of a preliminary hearing date.

Harris was arrested in Pocatello Wednesday on warrants charging him with second degree kidnapping and assault with intent to commit rape.

Pocatello detectives said Harris admitted the abduction of Janice Lannan, about 18 miles north of Rupert. He denied, however, that he forced the girl's father, Clarence Lannan, and uncle, Louis Lannan, out of his car, claiming that they got out voluntarily.

The father, an itinerant farm worker from Ionia, Mich., told police he and his brother were forced out of the auto under

threat of death.

Harris refused to sign a statement, police said.

Girl Hysterical

The girl was found about four hours after the alleged kidnapping barefoot, lightly clad and hysterical—walking toward Rupert. She was taken to a local hospital for examination, and attendants said she had been molested, but not criminally assaulted.

She told officers Harris took her to a lonely shack where he forced her to disrobe and commit an indecent act. She said she later escaped from his car when he stopped to search for a knife he had dropped.

WHERE'LL YOU HAVE YOUR BABY?

Young American mothers or expectant mothers are pitifully ignorant of embryology, prenatal care, childbirth, and infant care, as a general rule.

Young American fathers or expectant fathers are just as ignorant of these vital matters as their wives are and this explains why they readily submit to whatever indignities the "officials" in the hospital impose upon them. Their ignorance explains also, I think, why many a young man, separated from his wife at the supreme moment of their married life, ends up by deserting wife and child.

I tell you, folks, the notion that a young expectant mother

must have an obstetrician and not just an ordinary family physician attend her is absurd.

Mind, now, I'm speaking here of trick obstetricians, the kind that merely put up an imposing front in order to compete with the general practitioner for the \$500 trade. There's a plague of these in business today. Of real obstetricians, the kind to whom physicians refer patients, there are relatively few.

As a kind of primer for young prospective parents, I offer Preparing for Maternity, a booklet for which send 25¢ and stamped, self-addressed envelope.

I advise every young man who is expecting to study with his wife everything she studies in preparation for the blessed event; to accompany her whenever she visits the doctor for instruction or advice; and to remain at her side at the supreme moment. If hospital "rules" do not permit this, don't patronize the hospital.

Australia Anticipating Place in Film-Making World

Sydney —(U.P.)— Australia is anticipating a place in the film-making world now that an American producer, Joseph Kaufman, has made "Long John Silver" here and expressed enthusiasm for this country's advantages in the field.

Kaufman, stressing the lower costs here, said his film will "look like a three or four million dollar job but cost only about one million."

Kaufman has high hopes for boosting the movie industry in Australia on the basis of what he considers "remarkable" talent available here—not only actors, but technicians, writers, and designers.

He expects world-wide recognition for four players in particular—12-year-old Kit Taylor (who almost steals the show from veteran Robert Newton), Grant Taylor (Kit's father), Rodney Taylor (no relation), and Lloyd Berrell.

Kaufman said it amazed him to see such a brilliant art production designer as William Costable, who handled production for "Long John Silver," stay in Australia for so long. His set and costume designing skill would put him in demand anywhere, Kaufman said.

The producer mentioned the adaptability and quick-learning of the Australian technicians, who were quite new to the requirements of the film industry.

"The beautiful scenery of Australia, captured in CinemaScope and color, has given this picture great scope and will show the world the beauty of the Australian scenery and background," he added.

At present, his firm, Treasure Island Pictures, is producing 26 half-hour featurettes based on the film, which will be used for theatre and television screenings all over the world.

Future plans for Australia include the production of at least three big pictures in the next two years. Arrangements have been made for an option on the

I hope you will read it carefully and then write me again—you write an exceptionally fine letter—and give me your ideas about preventable respiratory infections. If you and I work together on this problem, Cynthia, we may be able to achieve something worthwhile. If other kids reading this have any ideas to offer we'll be glad to hear from them.

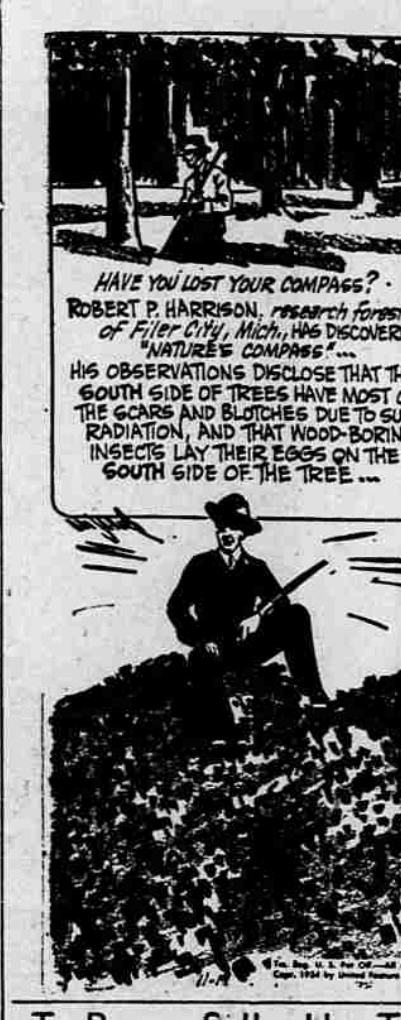

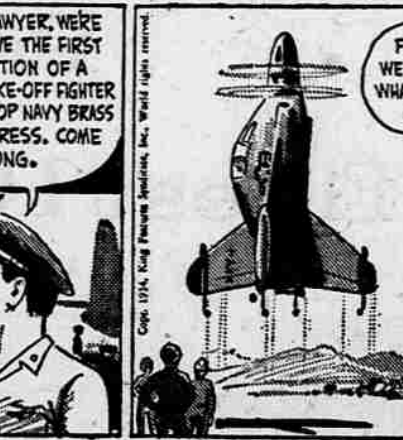
