Douglas Fir Cones Bring \$2 a Bushel

Corvallis, Ore. — (U.P.) — Every youngster who has tramped through the woods knows the cones from everygreen trees make good throwing. But what most of them don't know is that the cones are worth money.

The U.S. Forest service is paying up to \$2 a bushel for Douglas fir cones.

The cones contain tree seed. This seed is taken from the cone and distributed to farmers and other forest land owners for use in reseeding cutover lands and other bare forest areas.

The service says the harvesting of forest tree seed is becoming as much of an industry in the Pacific Northwest as that of any other farm crop.

Rex Wakefield, supervisor of the Siuslaw National forest, says \$2 a bushel is being paid for Douglas fir cones, with slightly higher prices for some other evergreen varieties.
