Ministerial Group Sets Thanksgiving Day Rites

The Junior Thanksgiving service sponsored by the Medford Ministerial association will be held this year at 4:00 a.m., Thursday, Nov. 25, at the First Methodist church. Presiding over the service will be the Rev. Willis Loar, president of the association. The message will be given by the Rev. Raymond W. Hurn, pastor of the Church of the Nazarene.

Other ministers who will participate in the service will be Dr. Raymond E. Balcomb, Weldon F. Colbaugh, Clynton G. Crisman, Dr. D. Kirkland West, G. H. Hillerman and Thomas McCamant. Music will be furnished by one of the units of the Junior high school music department under the direction of Raymond Lewis.

The offering this year will be divided between the Jackson county board of Christian education and the Share Our Surplus program of Church World Service. This SOS distribution of food is described as "the greatest world wide food relief program" in the history of American churches. The food is furnished by the United States government from the surpluses in its warehouses. The distribution is to be handled by the churches through their experienced agency Church World Service. Thus the value of all offerings will be multiplied about 20 times in the value of the commodities that the needy people will receive.

Presbyterians To Receive Gift of Church Carillon

A set of 25 carillon bells will be presented Sunday to the First Presbyterian church by Mrs. Callie Palm, longtime resident of Medford. The presentation and dedication will be made during both morning services at the church.

In giving the bells to the church Mrs. Palm has fulfilled "a longtime dream." "It has been my hope and prayer that I might be able to do this very thing," Mrs. Palm told church officers.

The carillon is similar to a set at the Arlington National cemetery, the Westminster choir college at Princeton and many other colleges and churches.

Coronation Model
The set is known as a Coronation model and consists of 25 notes, two full octaves, with a range starting at "G" below middle "C." The tone source of the bells is a set of tuned bell metals, struck by hammers which are electrically operated from three manual Reuters organs. The tones are so true they may be played not only singly but also in harmony and parts.

They can be played to be heard in the church or outside, or both. For example, the church officers point out, at

either Christmas or Easter while the congregation is singing to the bells inside the church, the same music will be heard throughout the out-of-doors in the church area.

Any Volume
Any volume can be maintained and the bells may be installed and repaired with little trouble, the officers explained. If the bells were cast the total weight of this set would be over 80,000 pounds. The largest one would weigh over six tons.

Vesper Hymns
Mrs. Palm has in addition to purchasing the bells, secured an automatic player which will play vesper hymns each evening at 5:30 p.m. The Westminster time signal has been added which will sound the time on the hour. The time signals will be limited from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m.

"We are indeed indebted to Mrs. Palm for her loving gift so generously given," the officers of the church explained. Vesper hymns will be played beginning Monday at 5:30 p.m.

Advent Christian Pastor To Retire

Mrs. Laurel Lee Crabb, pastor of the Advent Christian church for the last four years, has resigned and will retire.

The Crabbs came to Medford in 1950 to assist in the church building program. Mr. Crabb, as president of the Willamette Valley Advent Christian conference, was interested in the church building program and Mrs. Crabb aided in the work as pastor of the group. 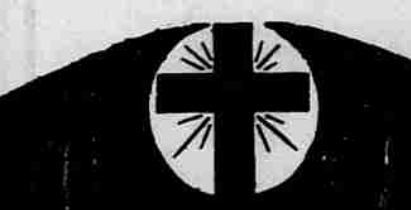
