

Plans To Impound Water in Canada Receiving Study

Portland — (U.P.) — Plans of three non-federal power agencies to impound water in Canada to create greater power generation in the United States are now under study by five federal agencies.

In a joint announcement, Col. L. H. Foote, North Pacific division engineer, and Dr. William A. Pearl, Bonneville power administrator, said the non-federal plans are being considered by the Army Engineers, the Federal Power Commission, and three Interior Department agencies—BPA, the Bureau of Reclamation, and the Geological Survey.

Washington Water Power Company Kaiser Aluminum Company and Puget Sound Utilities Council all are eyeing British Columbia sites for water storage at Mica Creek Arrow Lakes and Kootenay Lake.

If the plans materialize, after winning Canadian approval, the resulting stream regulation would increase United States power production downstream on the Columbia and would also provide increased flood control benefits.

A recent announcement from both the Army and the Interior Department in Washington, D. C., said that when estimates of costs, power and other benefits are assembled, it will be possible to compare relative advantages of the different proposals and to appraise the relative interests of both countries and of both federal and non-federal groups.

Phenix City Jury Convicts Vice Lord

Phenix City, Ala. — (U.P.) — A jury Friday night convicted Godwin (Sonny) Davis Jr., 22, accused "young vice lord" of a smashed crime empire, on the first of 44 lottery charges.

The prosecution described the pudgy son of a reputed gambling kingpin here as the heir apparent to a now-defunct \$250,000, 000 a year national lottery operation.

Although young Davis' connection with the organization was not borne out by direct testimony the jury deliberated only 45 minutes before reaching a guilty verdict. Davis faces up to a year in prison.

Special Judge Walter B. Jones, presiding over the Russell County Circuit Court for a state-ordered cleanup drive, postponed sentence until Dec. 6 and allowed Davis to go free under bond until then.

Davis still faces trial on 43 similar counts and his father on 44 counts of gambling law violations. They were among a large number of former gamblers indicted by a special grand jury.

Kidnaping Suspect Bound Over to Court

Rupert, Ida. — (U.P.) — Bill Harris, 58, negro laborer, was bound to District Court Friday despite his plea that he didn't touch or threaten a girl he is accused of kidnaping and molesting.

Justice of the Peace Frank Friesen ruled there was enough evidence to send Harris to trial, and continued bond of \$5,000 on a charge of second degree kidnaping and \$3,000 on a count of assault with intent to commit rape.

Harris was accused of abducting 16-year-old Janice Lanney here Tuesday night. She was found about four hours later and told a tale of being taken to a lonely shack and molested.

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Wife Refuses To See Man Legally Dead for 10 Years

Edinburgh, Scotland — (U.P.) — James Martin, officially "dead" for 10 years, wanted to go home to his "widow" Saturday but she was so upset on hearing he is alive that she refuses to let him enter.

Martin, 59, came back to Scotland from London after learning that Mrs. Martin was attempting to collect money from some of his pre-war investments.

He disappeared from Bramely, near Winchester, in 1944 during a Nazi air raid.

Working for Army "I was working for the United States Army as a security guard in a camp near London one night when there was an air raid," Martin said, "I decided not to go home and my wife must have decided I was dead."

"For two weeks I slept in parks and air raid shelters. Bombing was going on all the time. Maybe my mind became a bit unhinged. I was in a horrible state of nerves and decided to chuck it and get away from it all."

Anderson Renews Attack on Army's 'Atomic Cannon'

Albuquerque, N. M. — (U.P.) — Sen. Clinton P. Anderson (D-N.M.) Saturday renewed his attack on the Army's "atomic cannon" as "a foolish invention, a sitting duck for 600-mile-an-hour airplanes."

Anderson, who returned here from Washington Friday night for a brief vacation, said he plans to continue objecting to wholesale adoption of the cannon "until others start to question it too."

The New Mexico senator charged Friday in Washington that the new super cannon is more useful as a parade showpiece than as an instrument of war.

World War I Concept "The concept of the atomic cannon belongs to the first World War," he said. "But we are not going to be fighting War I or even World War II. The gun is defenseless by today's standards."

He said a second world war type bazooka could knock it out. He added that atomic experts consider the cannon shell a "wasteful form of using fissionable material."

Anderson charged that the Army's insistence on development of the atomic cannon upset the "unbelievably" good teamwork of the Los Alamos Atomic Laboratories, the Sandia Special weapons base and Kirtland Air Force base here.

France, Tunisia Slate Ultimatum On Reign of Terror

Paris — (U.P.) — The French and Tunisian governments worked together Saturday on a joint ultimatum to North African terrorists: Surrender and be pardoned or be exterminated by joint security forces.

Representatives of the two governments met in an atmosphere of urgency, spurred by new shootings and bombings in the running warfare between authorities and nationalistic terrorists.

Flies to Paris Tunisian Resident General Pierre Boyer de la Tour flew here Friday night for conferences on practical details of the new appeal and it was reported the plan may be worked out by nightfall. However negotiations were expected to continue all week end.

Boyer de la Tour, acting premier Edgar Faure and Christian Fouchet, minister for Moroccan and Tunisian affairs, planned to meet late today with Tunisian Premier Tahar Ben Ammar and members of his cabinet.

Informal sources said the still unannounced plan calls for special emissaries to go into the wild mountain areas of Tunisia and inform the outlaw chiefs of the joint offer.

When enough time has elapsed for the outlaws to learn of the offer France and Tunisia will join in hunting down the fellagha outlaws who refuse to stop fighting.

Tunisia was generally quiet Friday, but violence broke out anew in neighboring Algeria and in Morocco.

Pope Pius Undergoing New Health Program

Castelgandolfo, Italy — (U.P.) — Pope Pius is undergoing a new series of "health building" injections but is in "good health," Vatican sources said Saturday.

The sources said the injections by Swiss Dr. Paul Niehans began three days ago and were part of a two-months cycle that has been going on almost steadily since the illness of the 78-year-old Pontiff last January.

Today the Pope will travel from his summer residence at Castelgandolfo to the Vatican to climax the beatification of Jean Martin Moye, a priest of the Society of Foreign Missions of Paris and founder of the order of the Sisters of Providence.

Two Drowned After Light Plane Crash

Anchorage, Alaska — (U.P.) — An Anchorage man and his young son drowned Friday when a light plane went down in Cook inlet but the heroic bush pilot saved another passenger in a daring swim through icy waters.

Earnest Beagle and his son William, 4, drowned when the Piper Pacer plane of Bush Pilot Donald Johnson, Kenai, developed engine trouble nine miles north of Kenai while en route from Anchorage to Kenai and went down in the inlet.

Johnson quickly unfasted the seat belts of his three passengers and shoved Mrs. Florence Ramsey, Kenai, through the window of the plane. Then, with one arm clutching the woman, Johnson swam 500 yards to shore and safety.

Johnson immediately set out to aid the other two passengers but collapsed of exhaustion.

Kefauver Attacks GOP Isolationists

Washington — (U.P.) — Sen. Estes Kefauver charged Friday night that "isolationist elements" led U. S. foreign policy astray for two years but said the administration may now be on the road to "peace through co-operation."

In a speech before the annual Congress of the Atlantic Union Committee, the Tennessee Democrat praised the new pact to rearm Western Germany as a step in the right direction.

But Kefauver criticized sharply past foreign policy and said Secretary of State John Foster Dulles must now "regret" that he frightened our allies' last year with talk of "massive retaliation." The senator said he believes that Dulles was influenced by "isolationist elements" who "still preach the doctrine of preventive war." He added that "I don't believe he (Dulles) thinks that way."

Flight Engineer Killed in Crash of Stolen Airplane

Biloxi, Miss. — (U.P.) — An air man killed in the crash of a stolen B-25 Friday night was believed to be a flight engineer who boasted to a girl friend in a bar he could fly the plane and would "buzz the lounge to prove it," the Air Force said Saturday.

A spokesman for Keesler Air Force base said authorities could not positively identify the victim as a missing flight engineer because the body was "torn to fragments" when the plane crashed and exploded in the Gulf of Mexico only 400 yards off a resort beach.

The name of the flight engineer was withheld pending positive identification and notification of next of kin.
