3 Webfoots Chosen for Shrine Game

Eugene — (U.P.)—Coach Len Casanova has announced that three members of the University of Oregon football squad have been chosen to play in the Shrine East-West game at San Francisco New Year's Day.

Casanova, who is an assistant to West head coach Lynn (Papay) Waldorf of the University of California, said he had received word from Shrine officials that guard Jack Patera and center Ron Pfeister had been invited to play in the annual classic. Quarterback George Shaw was named last week.

Casanova said only three members from any one school were allowed on the Shrine squad, and said he was proud that Oregon would have the maximum number of players.

The three players were key members of Oregon's squad. Shaw netted 1536 yards passing and running in 10 games to lead the nation's backs in total offense. Patera, 213 pounds, and team captain Pfeister, 206, were three-year lettermen like Shaw and were considered the major strengths in Oregon's line.

MORIYA FAVORED

East Lansing, Mich. — (U.P.)—Kikuo Moriyama of Wheaton College, a 29-year old Japanese runner who hasn't been beaten in five races this year, was favored to win the 16th annual NCAA cross-country championship today at Michigan State college. Kansas, the Big Seven team champion, is a strong favorite to add the NCAA team title to its honors.

Only major teams on the list were UCLA, Ohio State, and Oklahoma. Oklahoma still has one left with Oklahoma A and M, Nov. 27.

Two teams dropped from the perfect record ranks during the weekend. Delaware State bowed to St. Augustine, 12-6, and Florida A and M lost to Southern university, 59-23.

Apart from Oklahoma, the unbeaten and untied teams which still have not completed their schedules are Southern university, Tennessee State and Trinity, Tex.

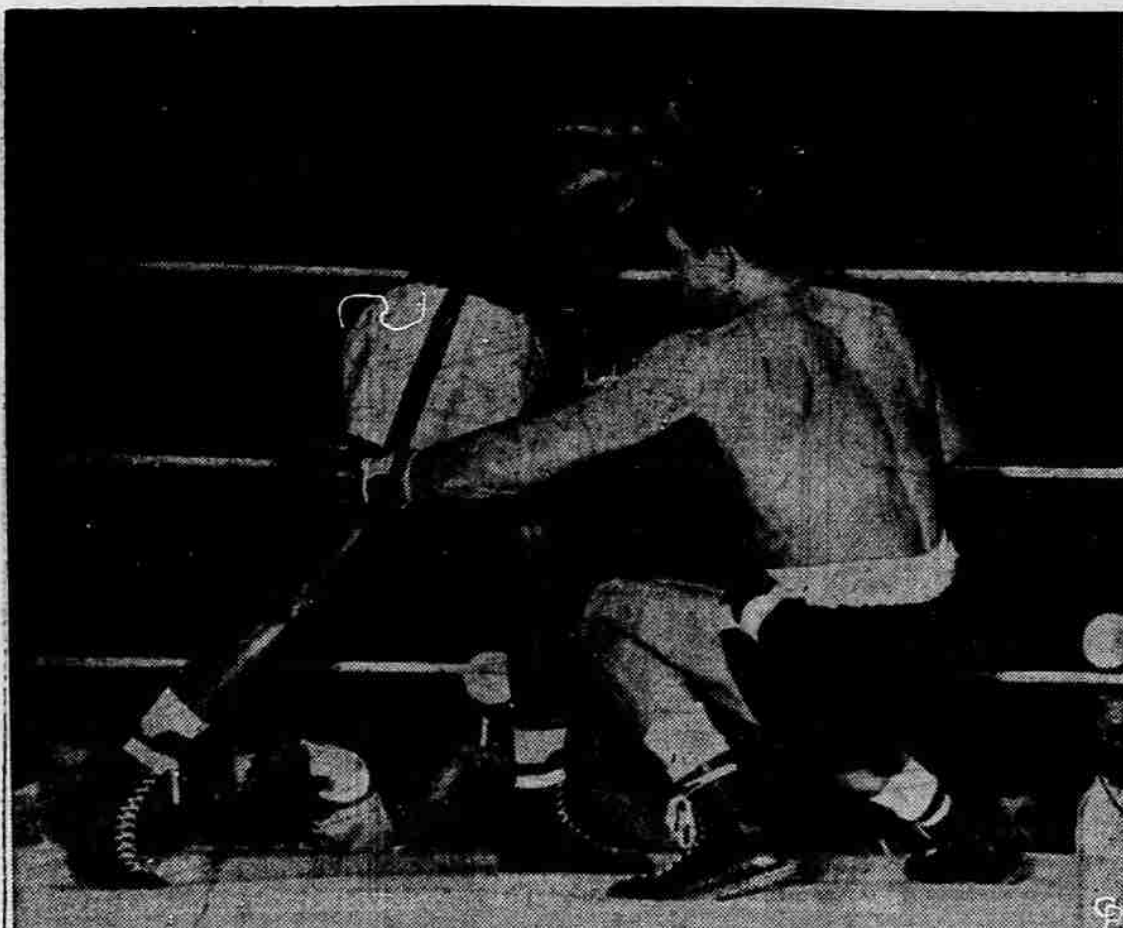

Portland — (U.P.)—Oregon and Oregon State were able to look back over their respective disappointing football seasons today, after Saturday's annual "civil war" completed their seasons, but both schools found reasons to rejoice.

Oregon State ended the season with one win and eight losses and tied with Washington for the PCC cellar with a 1-6 conference mark. But the ambitious Beavers, fielding a sophomore squad, gained a wealth of experience by its tough scheduling, which included three of the nation's top ten teams.

Quarterback George Shaw finished his collegiate career in a brilliant manner against the Beavers, passing to three touchdowns and clinching the nation's total offense title with 121 yards gained passing and running for a seasonal net of 1,536.

Withrow and Ray Westfall, Oregon State's sophomore sensation, completed 10 of 20 pass attempts for 154 yards to overshadow Shaw's five completions out of 15 tries for 125 yards.

The victory was the first Coach Len Casanova of Oregon has won over an Oregon State team coached by Kip Taylor. It also broke a five-game Beaver winning string.

Couch Heads Pear City

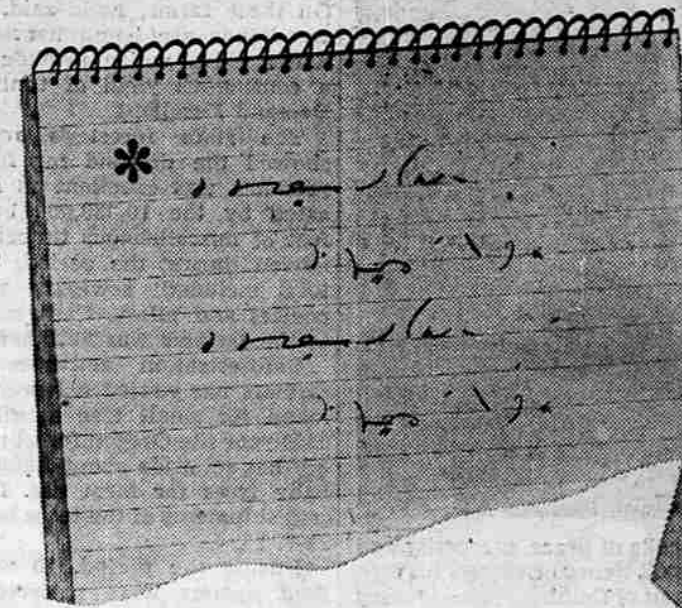

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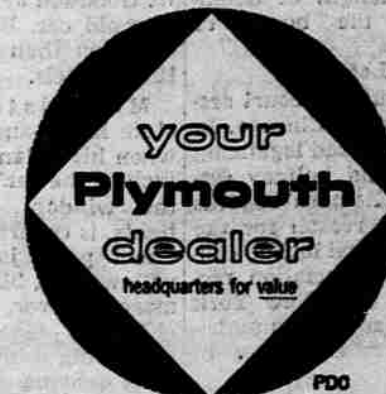
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
