Man Buys Molasses in 100-Pound Sacks

Ballston Spa, N.Y. — (U.P.) — Howard Albring buys molasses in 100-pound sacks, what with half a million hungry mouths to feed.

Albring used to work on a radial drill at a locomotive plant in Schenectady, but now he's a rancher—a worm rancher.

His corals are cardboard boxes and his livestock consists of 500,000 worms. Albring feeds them, breeds them, and sells them to fishermen and farmers.

What started as a hobby became a full-time job when the factory laid him off two years ago.

"Night crawlers"—bought from local kids—are hard to breed, Albring said. He is now raising "giant reds" to compete with them.

The giant reds are giants only when compared to other worms—"red wrigglers," for instance, the common, garden variety of worm.

Most of Albring's livestock are the red wrigglers, and it is for them he buys the 100-pound sacks of molasses. When the worms are fat and tender, he packs them in small boxes and sells them to week-end crowds.

Worms lay eggs. In about a month, the eggs hatch and two to 20 worms come out. It takes them another month to turn from white to red.

In about half a year the worms are ready for sale—or for Albring himself, a confirmed fisherman.

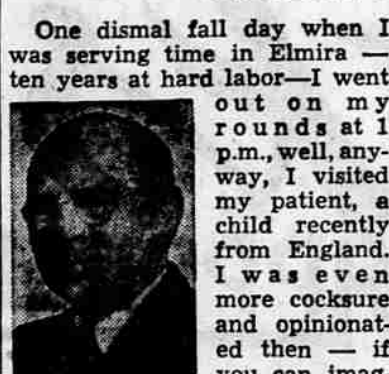

SOMETHING YOU ATE, EH?

One dismal fall day when I was serving time in Elmira—ten years at hard labor—I went out on my rounds at 1 p.m., well, anyway, I visited my patient, a child recently from England. I was even more cocksure and opinionated then—if you can imagine—and so the behavior of the child's mother flked me. From the appearance of the child's lips, gums, nails and eyelid linings it was obvious that she was anemic. Today we'd call it nutritional deficiency anemia or, if the patient happened to be in her thirties or forties, the gray sickness. When I asked how long the child had been sick the mother feigned astonishment and said the child had never been sick.

Then why had I been called... Presently the lady said the difficulty. We all laughed. In England, it seemed, when you're ill but it's something you et you're sick. In America vice versa.

But I have a vivid recollection of that dismal day because shortly after the visit to my patient I began to feel uneasy in the epigastrium, a vague distress which gradually became more insistent. Then I had a chill and took to bed where I just couldn't get warm. And all the time tension (not pain) in the region of the solar plexus increased and I was moaning and writhing when the doctor arrived.

In the first hour or two the seizure was complicated by a very disturbing thought. I had eaten a hunk of fresh coconut just before I started on my rounds. Maybe this was acute indigestion! That would have been more than I could endure. Might just as well have the gout or get sinusitis from going without a hat or develop arthritis or arteriosclerosis from taking too much calcium (in milk, cheese, beans, greens, nuts and peanuts). If the seizure had been what I insist doesn't happen I could never again have faced the poor geeks who have acute indigestion of one kind or another beyond any doubt of which their minds are capable.

But, happily, and I mean happily, for it was a tremendous relief, when the doctor arrived, about 5 p.m., and diagnosed appendicitis and sent me to the hospital where he operated next morning, found a gangrenous appendix, dredged it, put in drainage and sent me on my way rejoicing. Except the extreme tension I felt before the condition was diagnosed, there was not a moment of pain or discomfort in the eight or nine days I was hospitalized and never any trouble afterward.

A great many cases of alleged "acute indigestion" prove to be appendicitis, gallstone colic, renal colic or perhaps the discomfort, pain or distress that the victim feels in the upper, middle or lower belly is referred from the actual seat of trouble somewhere in the chest, as one feels a tingle in the little finger upon striking the ulnar nerve (funny bone) inside the elbow.
