Buffalo Medics Aid Handicapped

Buffalo, N. Y. — (U.P.) — Children with cleft palates and hare-lips, once destined to be social outcasts, are now taking their normal places in the world because of work being done by a well-integrated team of Buffalo specialists.

These handicapped children are being treated by the J. Sutton Regan Cleft Palate Foundation, a pilot program financed largely by the state's department of health. They are among 250,000 persons in the United States with one or both of the congenital defects.

Some years ago these children would have been ridiculed by their playmates for their appearance and "funny" speech, rejected or overly protected by their parents, denied the vocational opportunities for which they were otherwise qualified.

Through the treatment at the clinic, however, the youngsters obtain correction of physical and psychological defects, and gain the assurance they need to lead normal lives.

The cleft palate team, headed by Dr. William E. Mosher, as administrative director, consists of two plastic surgeons, two orthodontists (who correct irregularities of the teeth), a prosthetic specialist (who constructs and fits mouth appliances), a pediatrician, a speech therapist, an otolaryngologist (nose and throat specialist), a dentist and a social worker.

These specialists, meeting semi-monthly at the Children's hospital, decide the extent of treatment needed, the most propitious time for carrying out the various procedures, and generally discuss the individual cases from all angles.

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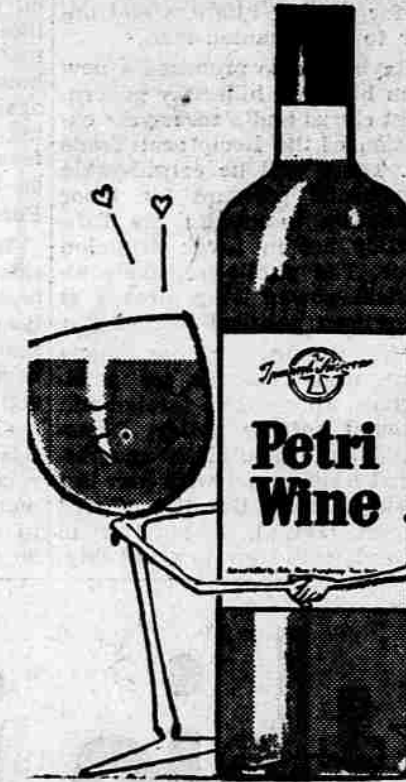
