

## Pioneer's Everett Picked On Little All-Coast Team

### Art Luppino Needs 10 To Best Husker

New York — (U.P.) — Art Luppino, the Arizona sophomore who is almost certain to be the nation's top major-league ball carrier this year, needs to score only 10 points in his last game Saturday to become the highest scorer in the last 34 years.

Luppino has completely outclassed the field by tallying 21 touchdowns and 22 extra points for a total of 148, NCAA Service Bureau statistics showed today. He scored 10 last Saturday against Wyoming this week to surpass the 157-point output of Nebraska's Bobby Reynolds recorded in 1950. No one else has scored that many since Jim Leach of VMI set the all-time major college record of 210 in 1920.

Right now Luppino is No. 9 on the all-time list. **Kick-Off Returns** — The stocky soph also has the 1954 kickoff-return title wrapped up. He has run 574 yards, more than 100 yards more than North Carolina State's George Marinkov, and all the other contenders are through for the year.

If it weren't for Luppino in scoring, though, there would be a close race in that department. Penn State's Lenny Moore wound up with 13 touchdowns for 78 points, which is good enough for second place right now. But Oklahoma's Buddy Leake, with 77, and Army's Tom Bell, with 72, each play Saturday. Colorado's Carroll Hardy is finished with 68 points but Denver's Rusty Fairly, who has 67, has two games left.

Five players who have completed their season have 11 touchdowns for 66 points — UCLA's Bob Davenport, Colorado's John Bayuk, Minnesota's Bob McNamara, Oregon's Dick James and Iowa's Earl Smith.

San Francisco — (U.P.) — Championship teams of five conferences are represented on the 1954 United Press Little All-Coast football team selected today by sports writers, coaches and sportscasters.

Only Fresno State and Cal Poly, winner and runner-up for the crown in the California Collegiate Athletic Association, were able to get as many as two places on the squad that has members hailing from as far south as San Diego and as far north as Walla Walla, Wash.

The other conferences represented are the Far West, the Evergreen, the Pacific Northwest and the Southern California.

**Three Rate High** — The No. 1 men on nearly every ballot were back Norm Nygaard of San Diego State, and Gus Maderos of Chico State and back Wayne Buchert of undefeated Whitworth. They were just about unanimous in their respective sections.

Others named to the first team were tackles Lyman Ehrlich, Fresno State, and Floyd Peters, San Francisco State; guards, Willard Whitaker, Fresno State, and Darrell Everett, Lewis and Clark; center Milt Schroter, of perfect-record Pomona-Claremont; end Bud Chadwick, Cal Poly, and Bob Ward, Whitworth.

## Perry Aims For Another 1,000 Season

Philadelphia (U.P.) — Joe (The Jet) Perry of the San Francisco Forty-Niners, one of the three National Football League performers to gain more than 1,000 yards by rushing in a single season, can turn the trick for an unprecedented second year in a row if he keeps his present pace.

Perry is leading the NFL in rushing with 778 yards for nine games, a total of 168 more than the second place, Paul "Tank" Younger of the Los Angeles Rams, sidelined by injuries at the present. John Henry Johnson of the Forty-Niners is in third place with 552 yards and the injured Hugh McElhenry of the Forty-Niners is fourth with 515 in seven games.

Perry, who led the league with 1,018 yards last year, is steaming along with a 6.5-yard average per carry. The former Compton Junior College bruiser is averaging 86.4 yards a game, a pace which can carry him over the 1,000-yard mark this season.

**Van Tops Passing** — Norm Van Brocklin of the Rams retained first place in passing in his battle to regain the passing championship he lost to Otto Graham of the Cleveland Browns last year. The big Dutchman averaged 10.15 yards for each pass thrown, and his 2,060 yards gained is high.

Jack Scarbath of the Washington Redskins and Tom Dubinski of the Detroit Lions rank second and third.

Billy Wilson of the Forty-Niners tops the pass receivers with 44 completions followed by Bob Boyd of the Rams with 42 and Pete Pihos of the Eagles with 41.

Bobby Walston of the Eagles is the leading scorer with 87 points including nine touchdowns, while Doak Walker of the Lions is second with 81. Harlon Hill of the Chicago Bears has nine touchdowns.

Pat Brady, defending punting champion of the Pittsburgh Steelers, sets the pace for the booters with Veryl Switzer of Green Bay leading in punt returns and Dick Lane of the Chicago Cardinals leading in interceptions with seven.

**Trojans Prep For ND** — Los Angeles — (U.P.) — Southern California staged its last drill today for Saturday's clash with Notre Dame in South Bend, Ind., which may be played in snow flurries, rain and biting temperatures. Flurries and rain yesterday forced the Irish indoors from the practice field for the second day in a row. The Trojans will work out briefly in sweat clothes today. They are scheduled to fly east tomorrow.

### Second Session of Independent Hoop League To Be Held Monday

A second meeting to organize the Medford Independent Basketball League for the 1954-1955 season will be held next Monday night. Exact time and place will be announced as soon as arrangements for a meeting place are arranged.

One of the best "kick-off" organizational meetings in recent seasons was held last night at the Medford Armory. About 20 men were at the session despite the fog. Seven prospective teams were represented. Three others sent reports that they were interested. It is thought that several groups not heard from last night may also want to join.

There was discussion at the session of limiting the league to 10 teams for 1954-1955 play. It was decided that attendance of a team representative at the Monday session should be mandatory if that team is to get into the circuit. If more than 10 groups are represented, it is possible that a larger circuit may be organized.

A team entry fee of \$35 was set and the clubs will be required to pay a fee of \$1 per player with \$10 team minimum for shower privileges at the gymnasium used here. Payment of the fees is requested at the Monday session and it may be that the first 10 clubs to lay their money on the line may be "the" league this season.

### Ex-Redskins Big Help To Contenders

Bill Singler served as chairman at the meeting last night and was continued as temporary chairman. Permanent officers for the season will be elected on Monday.

The Washington Redskins are camping at the bottom of the National Football League's Eastern Division but, ironically, they have contributed useful players to several of the current title contenders.

Don Paul of the Cleveland Browns, Harry Dowda of the Philadelphia Eagles, Ray Collins of the New York Giants and Hall Haynes of the Los Angeles Rams are among the former Redskins playing for clubs still involved in the division races.

Paul quit Washington when owner George Preston Marshall fired Curley Lambeau and made Joe Kuharich his coach last August. The Browns, trying to plug leaks in their defensive backfield, promptly hired Paul. He has become an important cog in a defensive unit that has helped the club take the Eastern Division lead by allowing its last five opponents a total of only 30 points.

**Eagles Assembled Cast-Offs** — The Eagles assembled a strong club from a number of cast-offs, including Dowda. Like Paul, Dowda is a defensive back. He caught end Pete Brewster on the Philadelphia 10 last Sunday to prevent a Cleveland touchdown on a pass play. The Browns won, 6-0, but Dowda's defensive play on Brewster might have made the difference if the Eagles had been able to score from inside the Cleveland five late in the game.

Collins has been an outstanding defensive tackle since he came to the Giants. Haynes is a defensive back for the Rams, who currently are tied with the Forty-Niners for second in the Western Division. Gene Lipscomb, 280-pound tackle, is another player the Rams obtained from Washington.

**Standings Will Improve** — Most of these ex-Washington players won't get into the championship game but they will wind up higher in the standings than their former Redskin teammates, who are tied with the Chicago Cardinals for last place.

The champion Detroit Lions and Green Bay Packers, who met Sunday, open this week's action with a return game Thanksgiving Day at Briggs Stadium. The Lions scored a 21-17 victory at Green Bay.

Greensboro, N.C. — (U.P.) — The Atlantic Coast Conference will make its choice Friday to oppose Nebraska in the Orange Bowl at Miami Jan. 1 and the representative will be announced Sunday. ACC Commissioner James Weaver said Wednesday that the representative will be chosen on the basis of being the "most representative team."

Duke and Maryland are expected to be the leading candidates with the winner probably depending upon the outcome of Friday's Duke-North Carolina game at Chapel Hill.

## Ford Inks Pact For Estimated \$13,000 Salary

Whitely Ford, Jack Harshman and Bobby Shantz, three southpaws who could shape the destinies of their respective clubs in 1955, figured in glowing reports today from three different baseball fronts.

Ford, a 16-game winner with the Yankees last season, signed his 1955 contract Wednesday for an estimated \$13,000 and said he was "looking forward to a 20-victory season" next year. The little left-hander was 10 pounds overweight at 185 last season but said he intended to go South and "cut down to about 175" in the spring.

Harshman, who compiled a 14-8 record with the White Sox, also signed for next season. The converted first baseman, who manager Marty Marion feels can become an 18 or 20-game winner, had a 2.95 earned run average and set a new club record by striking out 16 Boston batters in a single game last July 25.

In Philadelphia, Lou Boudreau, new manager of the Kansas City Athletics visited Shantz and said he found the little left-hander in a "first rate" frame of mind.

## Game Men List Hunting Mishaps

Portland — (U.P.) — Figures compiled by the State Game Commission today showed 43 hunting accidents in Oregon since the first of the year, ranging from fatal shootings to slight sparings with buckshot.

The tragic accident toll began on Jan. 30 when a 15-year-old boy shot himself as he climbed a fence. There were two deaths and three non-fatal hunting accidents before the start of the main hunting season.

The peak of the hunting accidents was reached on Oct. 23, the opening of the pheasant season, when nine persons were wounded.

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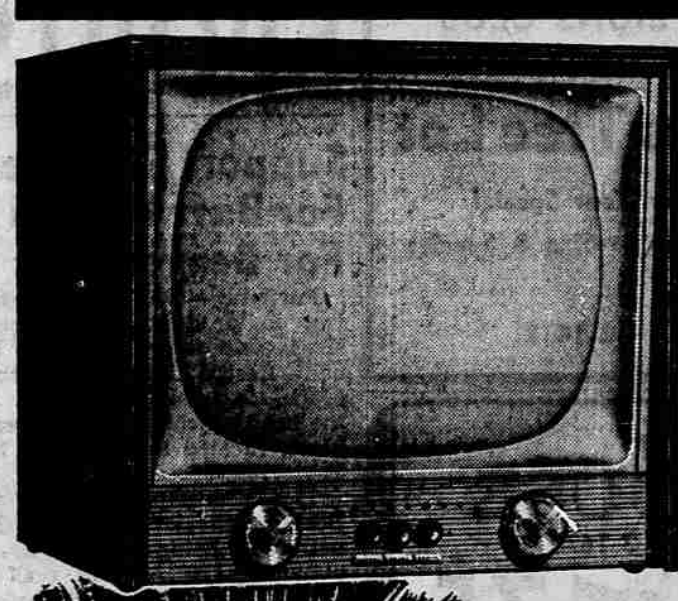
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
