

Buffer 'Plan for Peace' Said Discussed for Pacific

Los Angeles—(U.P.)—Authors of the Unden plan, which calls for a neutral belt through Central Europe as a buffer between Communist countries and the democratic West, are hurrying to formulate a similar plan for the Pacific, says the Los Angeles Daily News.

The newspaper, in a copyrighted story, said the Pacific "plan for peace" would be initiated by Marshal Tito of Yugoslavia and Prime Minister Nehru of India, "who will meet in India on or about Dec. 5."

The Pacific plan would call for a zone of neutral nations west of China, including Pakistan, India, Burma, Thailand and Indonesia.

The article on the Pacific plan, by Glenn Parson, managing editor of the Daily News, and his wife, Ruby Parson, followed their previous article on the Unden plan—a plan named for Dr. Osten Unden, foreign minister of Sweden.

The Parson article said the Unden plan has been drafted as a blueprint for peaceful co-existence with Russia. The European neutral belt would be made up of Finland, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, reunified Germany, Austria and Yugoslavia.

Stage Set in Capital
According to the article, the stage was being set in Washington for presentation of the Unden plan, which has been in the process of formulation for the past six months.

Under the proposal for Europe, Russia would agree to withdraw her troops back of the Oder-Niesse line and accept the Eden plan for free elections in a reunified Germany. The United States, France and Great

Tavern Argument Results in Death

Portland—(U.P.)—Two men got into an argument and went for their guns in Mysterious Billy Smith's tavern here yesterday. One landed in the morgue and the other in jail.

Willie Yarborough, 38, was killed. James Wilson, 52, was jailed.

Police said Wilson told them Yarborough had threatened him earlier in the day. Wilson said he went to police headquarters but was told to come back Friday since offices of the city attorney and district attorney were closed.

"So I went home and got my gun," Wilson said. "I wasn't going to let him run me off the street."

Later in the day, Wilson was at the bar in the tavern. He said Yarborough came in "and when he reached for his gun I let him have it. The floor was littered with empty shell casings. Deputy Coroner Theodore Lucas said a preliminary examination showed three bullet holes in Yarborough's body. Police said both men were armed."

Detectives said any formal charges against Wilson would await further investigation.

The story said Tito was selected to fly to the Far East to help launch the Pacific plan because in some ways his position is similar to that of Nehru. Both see themselves as independents.

Showgirl Says She Was Caught In Middle of Liberace Publicity

Hollywood—(U.P.)—Joanne Rio lamented today that her romance with piano idol Liberace, which has gone on the rocks, was "just a lot of publicity and I got caught right in the middle of it."

The pretty 23-year-old brunette said the television star gave her the cold-shoulder because he apparently was "embarrassed" over an intimate three-part series on their romance which she wrote for a Los Angeles newspaper.

"It's ridiculous for people to say we were engaged," Miss Rio said yesterday. "We never were. It was just a lot of publicity."

The showgirl said she couldn't understand why the curly-haired pianist should be indignant over her newspaper story because she showed it to him and his agent before it was published and "they didn't disapprove of it then."

"The only thing we asked the newspaper to leave out was a thing they put in about my saying, 'Wow!' after Liberace kissed me," she said. "You know I wouldn't say anything like that."

Asked what she thought about Liberace being embarrassed, the dark-eyed jilted showgirl snapped, "I'm the one who's embarrassed. I just agreed to that article because I thought it would help Lee."

Meanwhile, others lent their voices to the hassle. Only the smiling pianist himself proffered no comment.

Miss Rio's mother, Mrs. Eddie Rio, charged Liberace was the instigator of the publicity in the first place and accused him of not being a gentleman.

"Only a week before the romance was publicly announced," she said, "he told Joanne he loved her. He was so good to her, and now he's not being a gentleman."

Mrs. Rio, who said her family has been in a turmoil ever since the affair started, added that "Liberace was the one who started the romance."

The showgirl's father, Eddie Rio, fumed. "If they're just looking for publicity, I don't know why they picked on my daughter. . . I intend to get to the bottom of this!"

Seymour Heller, Liberace's manager, conceded there was nothing "basically wrong" with Miss Rio's stories, but added:

"I just didn't like the intimate details . . . kissing in the dark. I cleared the articles myself, but some of it I wanted left out. 'Joanne,' I said, 'This will hurt

Freak Storms Flood Parts of England

London—(U.P.)—New floods fed by torrential rains hit many parts of England today while freak windstorms buffeted shipping.

Two women, one 86 and the other 89, inmates of an old peoples home, were killed last night when wind brought down a chimney and part of the roof while they were waiting for a television program. Three others were injured seriously.

Residents of Devon in the west of England were just emerging from their worst flood in years when heavy rains sent rivers out of their banks again and flooded more than 100 South Devon roads.

Some 50 main roads in other parts of the country were inundated and hundreds of minor roads were waterlogged and impassable.

Chicago—(U.P.)—The world's greatest agriculture show, the 55th International Livestock Exposition, opens tonight in the International Amphitheater here.

The exposition will continue through Dec. 4. The traditional climax of the big show is the naming of the

grand champion steer. Last year the champion was owned by a young woman from Texas and she received a record price of \$20,000.

Indianization Progress Told By Firms In India

New Delhi—(U.P.)—The progress of Indianization in foreign-controlled firms in India has progressed favorably, according to the latest official figures. The only exceptions are plantation estates and jute companies.

An analysis of the latest returns shows that in the lowest salary group—\$62 to \$100 per month—virtually the entire personnel is Indian. The salary group from \$100 to \$200 per month also is now overwhelmingly Indian, the actual percentage having risen from 56.5 in 1947 to 93.3 in 1954.

These two categories no longer worry the government. It now attaches importance to the salary group of \$200 and above. In this case, the percentage, in respect of technical and non-technical posts has risen from seven per cent in 1947 to 32 per cent in 1954.

India, unlike other countries, has depended upon persuasion in getting foreign-controlled companies to hire Indians in the higher paying jobs. Every foreign-controlled firm has to submit to annual report on the number of foreigners and number of Indians it hires. This return has proved a corrective in most cases for many foreign firms that refused to hire Indians.

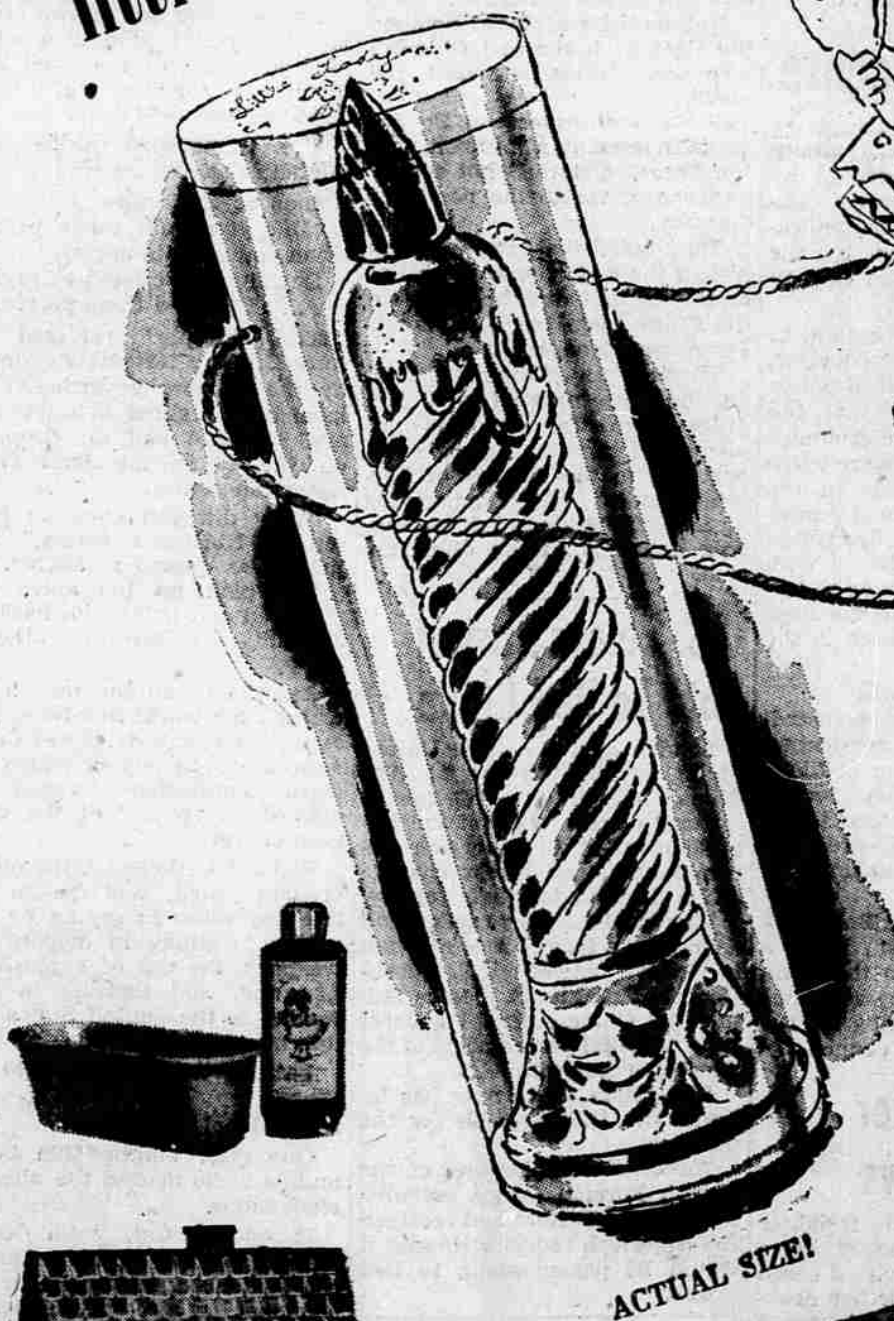
It is interesting to note that although the number of Indians employed has increased, the number of foreigners has stayed about the same. In 1947, there were 6,162 Indians and 7,623 foreigners in executive positions. In 1954, the number of Indians had risen to 18,642 while the number of foreigners rose only to 7,750.

Of the 7,750 foreigners employed in firms in India, 6,747 are British nationals, Americans number 230, Swiss 147, Germans 86, Danes 73, Dutch 67, Swedes 55, Pakistani 45, Chinese 40.

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
