

Two Youngsters Die In Trailer Blaze

Sacramento—(U.P.)—Billy West 5, and his sister, Linda, 1½, were burned to death while sleeping alone in their trailer here Friday night.

The children were put to bed by their father, William D. West, 24, who then drove to Roseville, Calif., to pick up his wife, Jerry, a restaurant employee. A third child escaped injury because she was watching television at the home of her grandparents. The trailer was parked at the rear of the home.

Sheriff's Lieutenant Roy Turner blamed a misplaced cigarette for the fire. West said he had smoked a cigarette in the trailer but said he snuffed it out in an ash tray.

Murders, Suicides Shock Californians

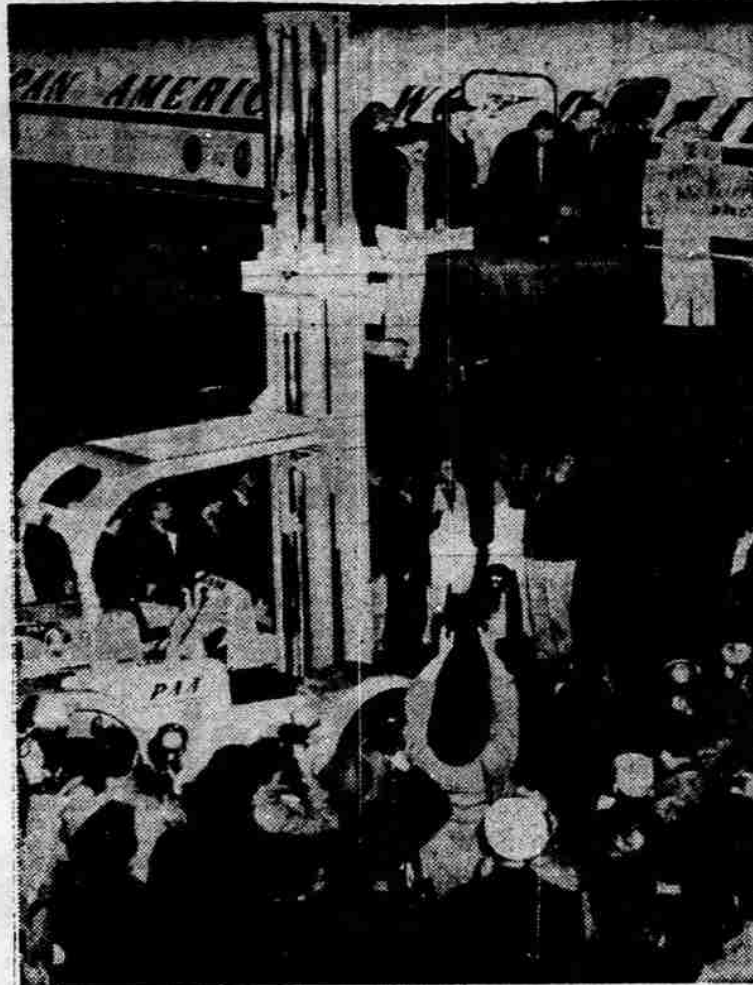
Fresno, Calif. — (U.P.) — Two separate murder and suicide tragedies shocked the San Joaquin valley area Saturday.

Ryo Mineo Washiya, 19, an escapee from Modesto State hospital, shot and killed his mother, wounded his father and then killed himself with a 12-gauge shot gun late Friday.

In Bakersfield, Robert Rogers, 55, shot his wife, Mrs. Ruby Rogers, 46, at pointblank range and then killed himself as they were sitting in a car with their two children.

Sheriff's deputies said Washiya escaped from the hospital Tuesday and returned home, 20 miles south of Fresno, as the family was eating dinner. They said Washiya shot his mother, Elizabeth, 40, after an argument over his escape. He chased his father, Frank, 55, into the yard and shot him in the back and then turned the gun onto himself.

Bakersfield police said Mrs. Rogers died instantly from two bullets from a .38 caliber revolver. They said one of the children, Barbara, 14, told them her mother and father had been "fighting for years" and that they had another argument before the shooting.

Two Arrested After High Speed Chase

Winnemucca, Nev. — (U.P.) — Sheriff Delbert Moore said Saturday two California boys arrested following a 100-mile-per-hour race through Winnemucca probably will be turned over to California authorities to face charges of assault with a deadly weapon.

The pair are Theodore Starkey, 15, and Herbert H. Hesch, 16, both of Van Nuys. They are accused of stealing a 1955 model car in Los Angeles and driving it to western Nevada by way of Bridgeport, Calif., where they allegedly fired several shots at highway patrolmen who tried to halt them for questioning.

The chase ended 20 miles east of here on Highway 40 when the stolen auto blew a tire and overturned. The boys were unarmed and surrendered without resistance.

Youth Charged With Kidnaping of Girl

Sacramento — (U.P.) — A third boy, Roger E. Stewart, 19, was arrested Saturday on charges of kidnaping a 14-year-old girl from Carson City, Nev.

Richard Lachapelle, 19, and Clarence Clifton Compton, 21, were arrested Thanksgiving day on charges of abducting Barbara Carr, 14. The girl told officers she came willingly. The three boys were expected to be returned to Ormsby County, Nevada, to face charges.

Two Victims of Mysterious Deaths Hospital Escapees

Tijuana, Mex. — (U.P.) — Two women who died mysteriously within a few minutes of each other Friday night were identified Saturday as inmates of Patton State Hospital, near San Bernardino, Calif.

Autopsies performed Saturday indicated both died of barbiturate poisoning. Authorities at the hospital identified them as Mrs. Janet Anderson Oelrichs, of Los Angeles, and Irene E. Morris, 24, of Coronado, Calif.

Released Friday
Attendants said Mrs. Oelrichs was released Friday morning in the custody of her husband for the day and never returned. Miss Morris, who lived in the same unit as Mrs. Oelrichs, disappeared at the same time.

Charles E. Oelrichs, of Los Angeles, told officers his wife slipped out of their hotel room

Suspect Admits Escape Charge

San Francisco — (U.P.) — Michael J. Sanchez, 24, whom police say has admitted molesting a seven-year-old girl, pleaded guilty Saturday to the charge of escaping from an officer.

Sanchez was arrested Friday when his victim, the daughter of a policeman, identified him as the man who molested her May 4.

At the hall of justice Sanchez made two attempts to escape. He tried to break out of the inspectors room while he was being questioned and later he ran screaming from the courtroom. Both times he was stopped by police.

He will face sentencing on the escape charge Monday.

Chrysler Comeback Bid Threatened by Labor Difficulties

Detroit — (U.P.) — Chrysler Corporation's comeback bid in the automobile sales field was threatened by labor troubles Saturday.

The 30,000 CIO United Auto workers in the Chrysler automotive body division were poised to strike Tuesday morning. DeSoto workers also have voted in favor of a strike. Plymouth workers were scheduled to take a strike vote today.

The strike threats caught the company in a vulnerable position. Chrysler, which turns out Chryslers, DeSotos, Plymouths, Dodges and Imperials, has just spent \$250,000,000 to restyle its 1955 models completely.

Sales Moving Fast
The new models were introduced just 10 days ago. Chrysler, announcing sales have been moving at a fast pace, has been working overtime to turn out enough cars to meet demand. It stepped up production schedules 10 per cent this week to try to catch up.

A serious strike at this time could ruin Chrysler's attempt to regain the big share of the automotive market it once held. Chrysler divisions normally have turned out more than 20 per cent of all cars. But in the past year this share slipped to 13 per cent and less, dividends were cut in half and profits for the first nine months of 1954 ran only about \$3,000,000.

The automotive body division turns out bodies for Plymouths, the low-priced bread-and-butter car of the corporation, Plymouth production slipped badly during the 1954 model year, and only this month returned to its old No. 3 spot in total production.

A strike at the automotive body division could affect Plymouth production almost immediately. It also could eventually affect production of other Chrysler cars. All divisions buy some parts from the automotive body plant.

Brother of Grid Ace Admits Attack Charge

San Pedro, Calif. — (U.P.) — Ernest Dandoy, 23, and Jack H. Neathery, 21, were held by police Saturday on charges they kidnapped and criminally attacked a young widow last Tuesday.

Dandoy is a brother of University of Southern California star football player Aramis Dandoy.

Police said both have admitted dragging Mrs. Marilyn Hitchcock, 27, of Harbor City,

from her escort's car and then raping her. Officers said Mrs. Hitchcock identified the men as her attackers. Neathery admitted the crime, and implicated Dandoy, who also confessed when arrested, police said.
