

Around Hollywood

Hollywood—(UP)—Eva Marie Saint, one of the bright new stars of the year, finally got to Hollywood for the first time this week — but she turned down movies for a television play.

Eva Marie was that heroine in "On The Waterfront" with the scrubbed, fresh face and long, natural blonde hair. The picture was made in New York and she had the curious record of being one star of a Hollywood movie who had never been to Hollywood, except for a vacation years ago.

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After combing through subsequent offers from film studios, Eva Marie at last is before the cameras here, but at CBS Television City for the General Electric Theater program tomorrow.

"The response from 'Waterfront' was tremendous and I was sent many movie scripts," she said. "But I didn't find a movie story I really wanted, while I have found many TV shows I liked."

Western Script
"Oh, I'd be happy to do a movie," she added, "if I get a good story. But one script they sent me was for a western in which all the girl does is stand around in color and look pretty."

The beauty who has rejected movies for television left her home town of Albany, N. Y., eight years ago to try her luck at acting. After years of "doing commercials and bits," she became a top New York TV actress who can pick her own roles. But it was a part in a Broadway play that won her "Waterfront."

"I liked working with Marlon Brando," she said firmly. "He was a perfect gentleman, and after all the things I've read about him..."

Publicity drums already are beating for Eva Marie to be nominated for an Academy Award for her sensitive portrayal in "Waterfront." But she seems remote from her success. For one thing, she confessed, she's still surprised she got the part.

Didn't Try
"I was watching some girls here," she said as she sat by the swimming pool at the Beverly Hills hotel. "They were beautiful starlets, and I looked at them and thought how I hadn't even tried to get into movies and I did."

She also does not think it strange that she turned down major studio contracts in favor of TV.

"Several TV actresses in New York get offers from the coast but they'd rather stay in New York and study and act," she said as she brushed back her long, little-girl hair-do.

"But doing good scripts on TV puts you ahead much more than one mediocre movie."

"Besides," she added frankly, "I'm too old to be a starlet."

Dec. 31 Deadline For AF Officers

All reserve Air Force officers now classified as in the Ineligible Reserve section have until Dec. 31 to reaffiliate with a participating reserve program element, or enroll in the Extension Course institute to insure retention of their commission.

This announcement was made by local officials of the 9091st Air center and 9417th Air squadron operating in the Medford area.

Existing regulations require 15 points earned during a year by the reservist to match the 15 points given gratuitously each year to every reservist. Those who had failed to meet this requirement on Jan. 1, 1954, were given a year of grace by placement in the IRS.

Those who don't return to participating status, must be considered for separation from the reserve, or for retirement if qualified. Those who still have a remaining reserve obligation will be retained in the IRS, available for call but not permitted to participate in or to receive any benefits of the reserve program.
