## Parental Question In Deportation Case

Portland — (U.P.) — A witness at a deportation hearing for 13-year-old Lee Fung Yew testified here yesterday the boy could not be the son of Mr. and Mrs. Lee Dean Hem, Portland, as claimed.

Dr. Arthur W. Frisch, professor of bacteriology at the University of Oregon medical school said blood tests showed the boy could not be the son of the Portland couple, who brought him here from China three years ago.

Dr. Frisch admitted that it was possible that Hem was the boy's father.

The hearing was being held before Hearing Officer Louis Haffman. The Hems contend that since they are American citizens, the boy is also a citizen. The government has charged the boy was illegally admitted to the United States.

Dr. Frisch said he had no way of knowing whether Hem was the boy's father.

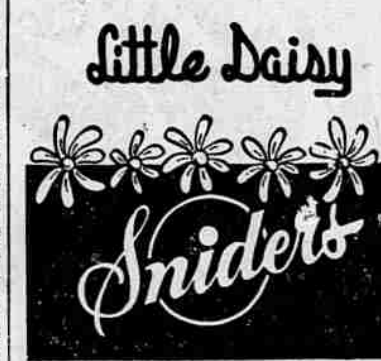

The youth is charged with the slaying of Peter Ribbers, 64, Nov. 11.

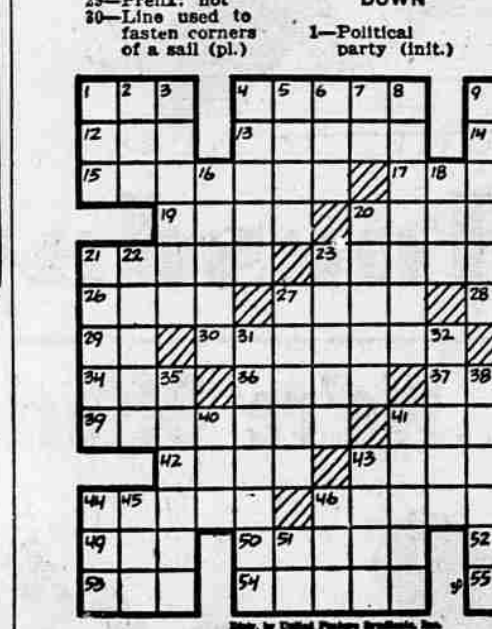
