Around Hollywood

Editor's note—The brightest 1954 film star is Grace Kelly, a beauty whose sudden success has mystified the entertainment world. In a series of three articles, United Press details Grace's rise and why she passed hundreds of other hopefuls.

Hollywood—(U.P.)—The most outstanding new star and hottest property of the year is a cool, blonde beauty who curiously violated all the traditional Hollywood rules yet seems destined to join the rank of top actresses.

In two years Grace Kelly has appeared in seven top-budget pictures, dispensing with the usual feature roles, struggling bits and cheesecake period.

Many a more beautiful, bosomy and experienced actress has asked, "What's she got that I haven't?" In the complex answer lies the recipe for what goes into the mixture of a movie star.

Ladylike Beauty

Grace has been described as a "ladylike beauty" yet you see the same types in the college Rose Bowl parade. She is a nearly flat-chested girl without the startling beauty of Elizabeth Taylor, the flamboyance of Marilyn Monroe, the dramatic fire of Bette Davis, the printable sayings of Zsa Zsa Gabor.

Yet her leading men in a brief period include Jimmy Stewart, Bill Holden, Gary Cooper, Ray Milland, Stewart Granger, Bing Crosby, Clark Gable.

Hollywood experts believe Grace is a success because she's a different type—a lady—than the current glamor girls. What is more important, is her timing. She came along at a time when the public was satiated with bosoms, sex and actresses with poor, unhappy backgrounds. The third reason is she has the drive to be a star.

One director calls her "a girl with stainless steel insides." Grace is unmarried and declares, "My career comes first." Bing Crosby says she "works her head off to get the performance the director wants from her."

Designer Edith Head, who has garbed Grace for her Paramount films, says, "She has an

amazing amount of confidence for a girl of 25. There's a lot of solid jaw under that quiet face of hers. She has a single-track mind."

Wealthy Background

Most of Hollywood is awed by her wealthy Philadelphia background, her obvious reserve and poise. Van Johnson calls her "a thoroughbred, as contrasted with cuties. The public has had so much sex pitched into its face it's gone for Kelly in rebellion against a broadside of broads."

Jimmy Stewart recently told an interviewer that Grace turned the Cinderella story upside down.

"Grace came to Hollywood from a happy home where she's been kindly treated and well educated," he said. "When she decided to be an actress, her family sent her to a dramatic school. By the time she reached Hollywood she was a skilled and competent actress. She didn't have to be nice to this guy or that to get ahead. She's a lady and expects to be treated like a lady. Because she does it without a sweater-girl build-up folks think she's some kind of an enigma."
