Big UN Vote Asking Red China Release Of Yanks Seen Help

Washington — (U.P.) — Diplomats said today that a big United Nations vote demanding release of the 11 U.S. airmen in Red China could win the flier's freedom.

They said such a vote, especially if it is supported by the bulk of the U.N.'s Asian members, would likely have an important effect on actions of the Peiping regime. Officials based their statement on a feeling that the Chinese Communists are sensitive to world opinion and especially to non-Western opinion.

Dulles To Express Views

They made the observations as Secretary of State John Foster Dulles called a new conference to express his views on the imprisonment of the airmen and other world problems.

The U.N. Steering committee voted over Russian objections Monday to put the plight of the American fliers on the General Assembly's agenda. Debate will begin Wednesday.

Some diplomats think the Chinese Communists are now just waiting to see what the world forum does. If the sentiment is overwhelmingly against Red China, authorities feel, the Communists may decide to release the airmen.

They said, however, that the Peiping government would have to find some loophole through which to "save face." Under no circumstances, they said, could the Chinese Reds be expected flatly to admit they had made a mistake.

Possible Course of Action

One possible course of action for Red China would be to announce that she is freeing the fliers in line with Communist China's professed desires for easing tension and helping

world peace. Actually, Red China laid the groundwork for such a course of action last summer at Geneva if she now wishes to follow it. In discussing the fate of Americans now held in China, the Communists said then that they would consider reducing or commuting sentences of prisoners who have records of good behavior.

Since then, Communist China has released 15 American civilians but no military personnel.
