

McGowan, Dean Of Umpires, Dies

Silver Spring, Md.—(U.P.)—Bill McGowan, 58, dean of American League umpires, died at his home today of a heart attack.

McGowan, who had umpired in the American League for 30 years, was retired on a lifetime pension only last Monday.

He had suffered a heart seizure last Saturday, but apparently was in good condition. His family said he awakened this morning complaining of a chest pain and collapsed in his bed.

McGowan, one of the most colorful umpires in the history of baseball, was forced out of action in Chicago last summer for the season by a severe attack of diabetes.

McGowan umpired in eight World Series and four all-star games.

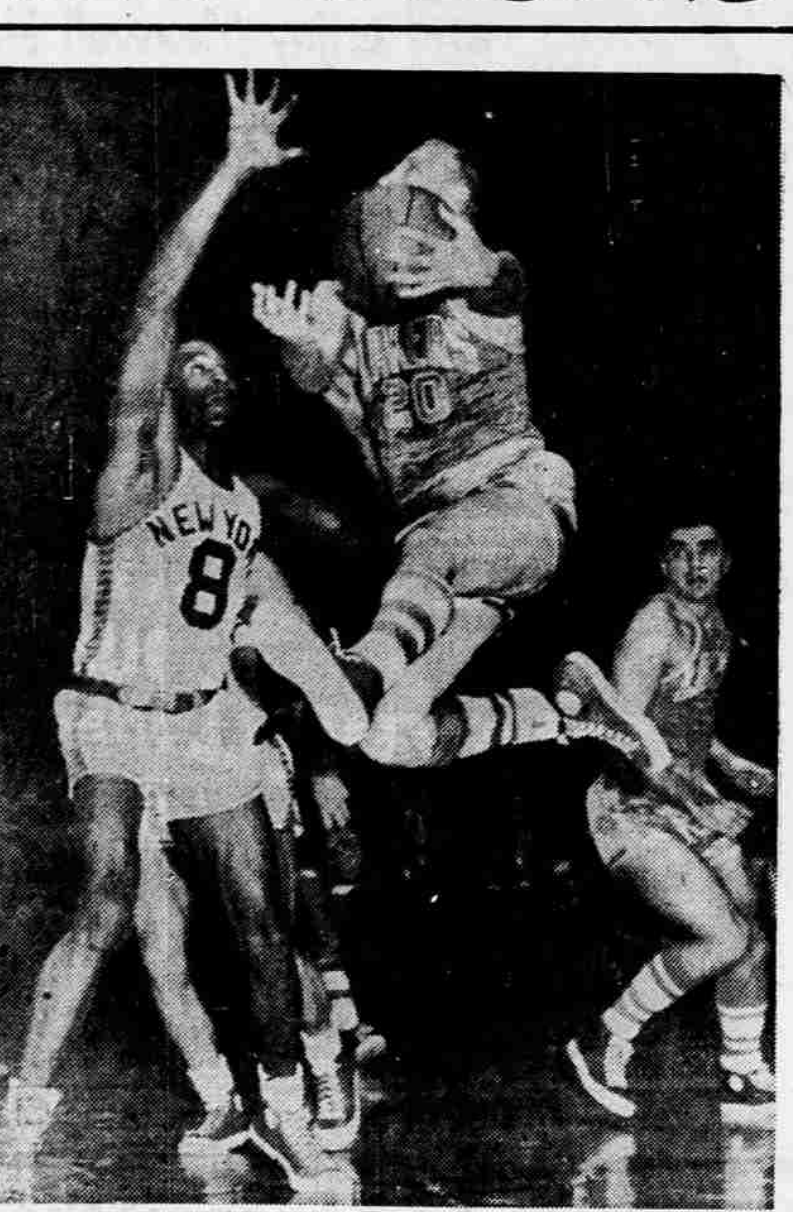
Consolation play is set for Friday afternoon with championship semi-finals in the evening. Finals are on Saturday night.

Hearing Slated On Angling Rules

Oregon sport fishing regulations will be tentatively set approximately one month from

now. After a public hearing at the Portland office of the commission on January 14, the tentative rules will be announced. The hearing will begin at 10 a.m., and summer and winter regulations for 1955 will be discussed. Persons or groups having suggestions regarding the regulations should submit them in written form to the game commission.

Following a 2-week interval after the publication of the tentative regulations a second public hearing will be held following which the final regulations will be set.

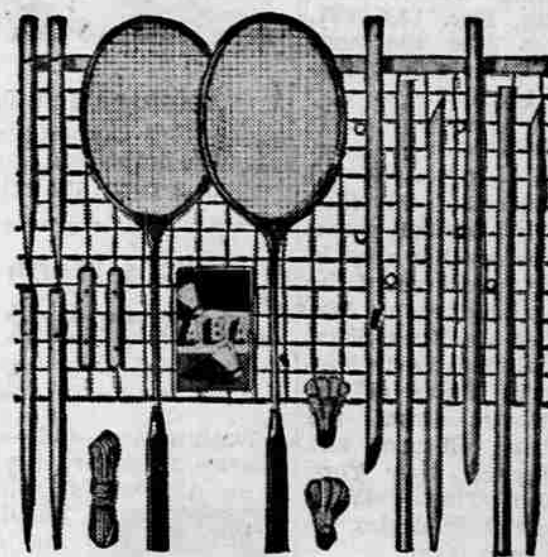
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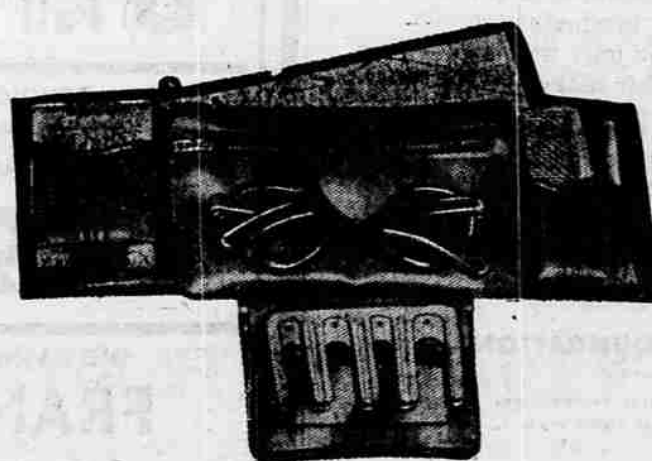
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
