Chicago — (U.P.) — Color television will make the black and white family portrait "obsolete almost overnight" a prominent photographer predicts.

Paul L. Gittings, former president of the Photographers' Association of America, said "the viewing public will become accustomed to color television so rapidly that the photographic industry will be hard pressed to keep pace with the consequent demand for color photos."

Weddings and society functions in the future, Gittings said, "will be recorded exclusively in color."

Your Health and Its Care

THERE IS ALWAYS DOPE

Few if any of you young'uns will remember, but I remember with a good deal of bitterness the picture of the charlatan who pointed heavenward telling prospective customers "There is hope!"

It was just an example of the shameful exploitation of popular credulity by quacks and nostrum vendors under the encouragement and protection of the federal government back in the days when Topsy was a coit and we were practically starving in Penn Yan.

Even the Yankee Wiseacres—who are the best customers of present day nostrums and quackery—would brush aside such creep-John sales talk today. They prefer more sophisticated explanations by an eminent specialist wearing a barber coat, a stethoscope etc.

However the suggestion may be propagated millions of Yankee Wiseacres now believe that aspirin is a cure-all, a good remedy for countless acute and chronic, minor and major illnesses. Furthermore in their childish innocence these soporiferous think aspirin is harmless in any circumstance.

Two years ago the St. Louis health commissioner, alarmed by the deaths of three infants aged 2½ to 6 months from aspirin poisoning, momentarily stepped out of the line drawn by big

business and the federal government to warn parents probably just once and in small print, that aspirin is a dangerous drug for the very young and should never be given to them except under medical supervision.

If a physician attending the patient prescribes aspirin, that's medical supervision. If a physician who learns by telephone from Mrs. Wiseacres that little Johnny got his feet wet or ran out without his overcoat that raw cold day last week and has a temperature of 101, advises Mrs. W. to keep him in bed, well under the covers, and give him aspirin—that, in my opinion, is malpractice, not from the legal viewpoint perhaps, but it is certainly not fair to little Johnny.

Before I mention the untoward effects of aspirin let me say here again that aspirin (acetylsalicylic acid) is the least dangerous analgesic (pain-killer) I know—notice I don't call it safe, but just less dangerous than other popular pain-killers such as acetanilid (phenylacetamide), phenacetin (a c e t p h e n e t i d i n),

aminopyrin, antipyrin etc. In an emergency I would not hesitate to take five or ten grains of aspirin (preferably the cheapest brand or make available for aspirin is aspirin no matter whose trademark is on the particular package) to relieve severe neuralgic ache or pain, provided I could remain at rest for an hour after the dose. But otherwise I would not risk health, comfort and well being taking such dope.

Aspirin sometimes causes nausea, heartburn, weakness, rapid pulse, collapse, angioneurotic swelling of face, lips, throat, eversion of eyelids, profuse sweating, severe asthma.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
Nursing the Baby
How can I tell when the baby gets enough milk nursing? If I stop the night feeding will it increase the amount of milk in my breasts? I have

no scale to weight the baby before and after nursing, so I can't be sure... (Mrs. C. C. A.)

Answer—If the baby is reasonably happy, not crying constantly, napping most of the time, he probably gets plenty of milk. Don't omit night feeding until the baby is 8 months old.
