Finance Minister in Japanese Government To Fight Inflation

Tokyo—(U.P.)—Hisato Ichimada, Finance Minister in the new Japanese cabinet, said today the government will follow a program designed to combat inflation and strengthen friendship with the United States.

In an exclusive interview with the United Press, the 61-year-old Finance Minister said the most important economic problem facing Japan today is the problem of "deflation" and he intends to continue the deflationary program of the previous regime. Tougher Attitude

He indicated, however, that a "tougher attitude" would be taken by the government and it would "set examples" of austerity for the rest of the nation to follow.

"I have no intention of changing our deflationary policy," Ichimada said. "That is our policy and we will follow it although we may have to adjust from time to time to meet developing situations."

He said there absolutely were no plans to change the Japanese Yen exchange rate.

Ichimada, who served for six years as governor of the Bank of Japan and is highly respected by foreign economic experts, indicated that one of his reasons for accepting the cabinet post was to insure good relations with the United States.

"One of the most important points in my policy is to have good U.S.-Japanese relations," he said. "This must never change. This is very important." Ichimada said Japan would welcome foreign investments depending on what they are for and whether or not they are needed here.

He expressed hope that Japan could get a government loan from the United States or from the World Bank and endorsed the proposed American-European foreign aid development program for Asia.

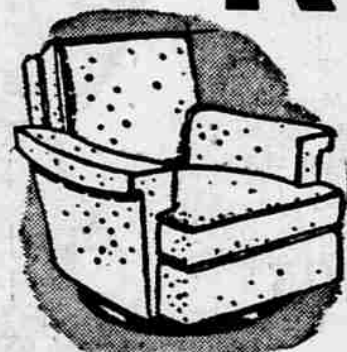
