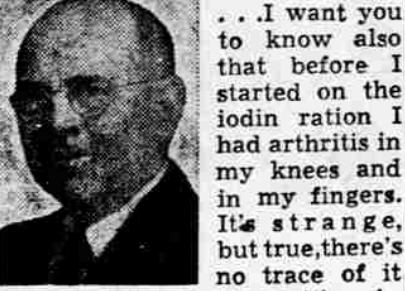

IODINE AND LAME JOINTS

After having taken six tablets a day for about two weeks (iodine ration, that is) I began to feel increased energy...

now, either in knees or fingers, and I am very thankful... (W. C. L.)

A good many other correspondents have reported similar relief of joint lameness from correcting iodine deficiency.

W. C. L. calls his joint lameness "arthritis," but tells nothing about it which would indicate whether the trouble is or was really arthritis or, as likely as not, rheumatism.

In the pamphlet Calcium and Rheumatism, available on request if you provide stamped, self-addressed envelope, I explain clearly the difference between chronic arthritis and rheumatism, as I see it. I must admit, however, that most people and, I believe, most physicians regard arthritis as a newfangled or scientific-sounding name for rheumatism and some folks harbor a smug notion that arthritis affects the upper class while rheumatism is "common among the poor, particularly washerwomen, day-laborers, and those whose occupation exposes them to cold and damp" (quoted from Osler's Practice).

In Osler's day, it is worthy of note, iodine in one form or another was almost invariably prescribed for joint disability. As a medicine, that is, say potassium iodide. It is not often used today.

One of my peculiar notions is that everyone with the rheumatism should take a wee bit of iodine in one form or another every day, say the equivalent of one-half grain of pure iodine a day—that's 20 times as much as nutrition authorities estimate each child or adult requires daily to maintain good nutrition.

Please understand I do not suggest that iodine or iodides used as medicine externally or internally will relieve or cure arthritis. I recommend it for the rheumatism.

The other remedies I recommend for rheumatism are calcium,

sunshine vitamin D and vitamin B-complex, and I tell in the Rheumatism pamphlet how to use them.

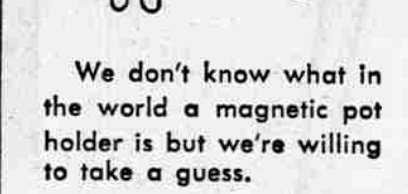
