Fidler, McKenzie Agencies To Join At First of Year

The insurance agencies operated by C. Lyall Fidler and Gordon S. Mackenzie will be consolidated as of Jan. 1, 1955, it was announced today.

The principal office will be at 122 East Eighth st., and a branch office will be maintained in Phoenix next to the post office.

With the association of the two agencies, the resulting concern becomes one of Medford's largest agencies, according to Fidler. Mackenzie will be manager and supervise the insurance department, and Fidler will be outside contact man and insurance servicing agent.

The real estate department, under the management of Bill Kerr, will handle all real estate transactions for the firm, with Fidler assisting.

Here Since 1950
Mackenzie came to Medford in July, 1950, when he purchased

the Ray Schumacher Insurance agency. In 1953 he consolidated it with the Sales Insurance agency of Phoenix.

Before coming here he was associated with several insurance firms in Portland. A World War II veteran, he was a captain of field artillery, serving in the south Pacific, later attending military intelligence school, and serving as an Oregon National Guard artillery major until last July.

Fidler came to Medford in 1942 as manager for the Hearst newspapers, and in 1943 joined the Harold Brown agency in charge of real estate. He formed his own insurance and real estate

firm in 1945, and in 1948 purchased the Gerson Kimball agency in Jacksonville, combining with his own. Last year he also purchased the Huff agency. He is well known here as an announcer and master of ceremonies for rodeos and other events, working with the Jacksonville Jubilee, the boat races and others. He is vice-president of the Kiwanis club, and has been active in that group's Kiwanis Kapers each year. He is a member of the International Footprinters association, serving as president this year. He owns and shows fine saddle horses, and has worked in projects for underprivileged children in the area.

Legislature To Get Recommendations on State Jobs, Salaries

Salem — (U.P.)—The Legislative Interim Committee on Retirement and Compensation will submit recommendations for widespread changes in state employee classifications and salary scales to the 1955 Legislature.

The recommended changes will be based on classification and salary study now being made by Harrington Associates, Inc., management consulting firm from New York City.

Differs Radically
This study differs radically from others conducted in the past in that one of the principal objectives of the study is to install a permanent system of classification and pay rates for each occupation based on the responsibilities of the position.

A Barrington official said the work so far accomplished has developed the fact that hundreds of state employee classifications are out of line with the work performed and he said widespread rates of pay also are out of line—too high or too low, with the requirements and responsibilities of the class of work performed.

Questionnaires Distributed
The first step in the study was the distribution of questionnaires to each employee of the state from the governor on down through every branch and level of government. Studies were made of these returns, which outlined the type of work performed by each employee, as tested to by his supervisor.

This matter having come on for hearing on November 22, 1954, at 10:30 o'clock a.m. by order of this court dated October 29, 1954, setting the time for hearing upon the petition to organize the above-named district,

It is hereby ordered that a written petition was presented for the exclusion of certain lands along Lone Pine Road within the boundaries of the proposed district, the court having received the hearing until December 1, 1954 at 10:00 o'clock a.m. the court having heard the evidence and weighed the objections of the person requesting exclusion, the court being duly advised that a part of the land described in the original petition would not be benefited by inclusion within the district, and the boundaries shall be amended to exclude certain parcels North of Lone Pine Road, now therefore:

It is hereby ordered that an election be held from 8:00 o'clock a.m. to 8:00 o'clock p.m. on January 12, 1955, at 2179 Crater Lake Avenue, Medford, Oregon, for the purpose of voting upon the question of formation of a water district with the following exterior boundaries:

Beginning at the section corner common to Sections 7, 8, 17 and 18 Township 27 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon; thence North 70°00'00" East along the center line of Crater Lake Avenue to the intersection thereof with the South line of a private roadway; thence West 45°00'00" East to the intersection of said South line with the center line of the new Crater Lake Highway; thence Southwesterly along the center line of said highway to the intersection thereof with the Easterly right-of-way line of the old Pacific and Eastern Railroad described in Volume 80, Page 609, Deed Records of Jackson County, Oregon; thence Southeastly along said Easterly line of said railroad, now known as Biddle Road, 495 feet, more or less, to the Northwest corner of the tract described in Vol. 371, Page 234, said Deed Records, being a North-
