The prelate said he was taking with him 100,000 cigarettes, 30,000 holy pictures, 25,000 rosaries, medals and other holy articles and a quantity of toys for Korean children.

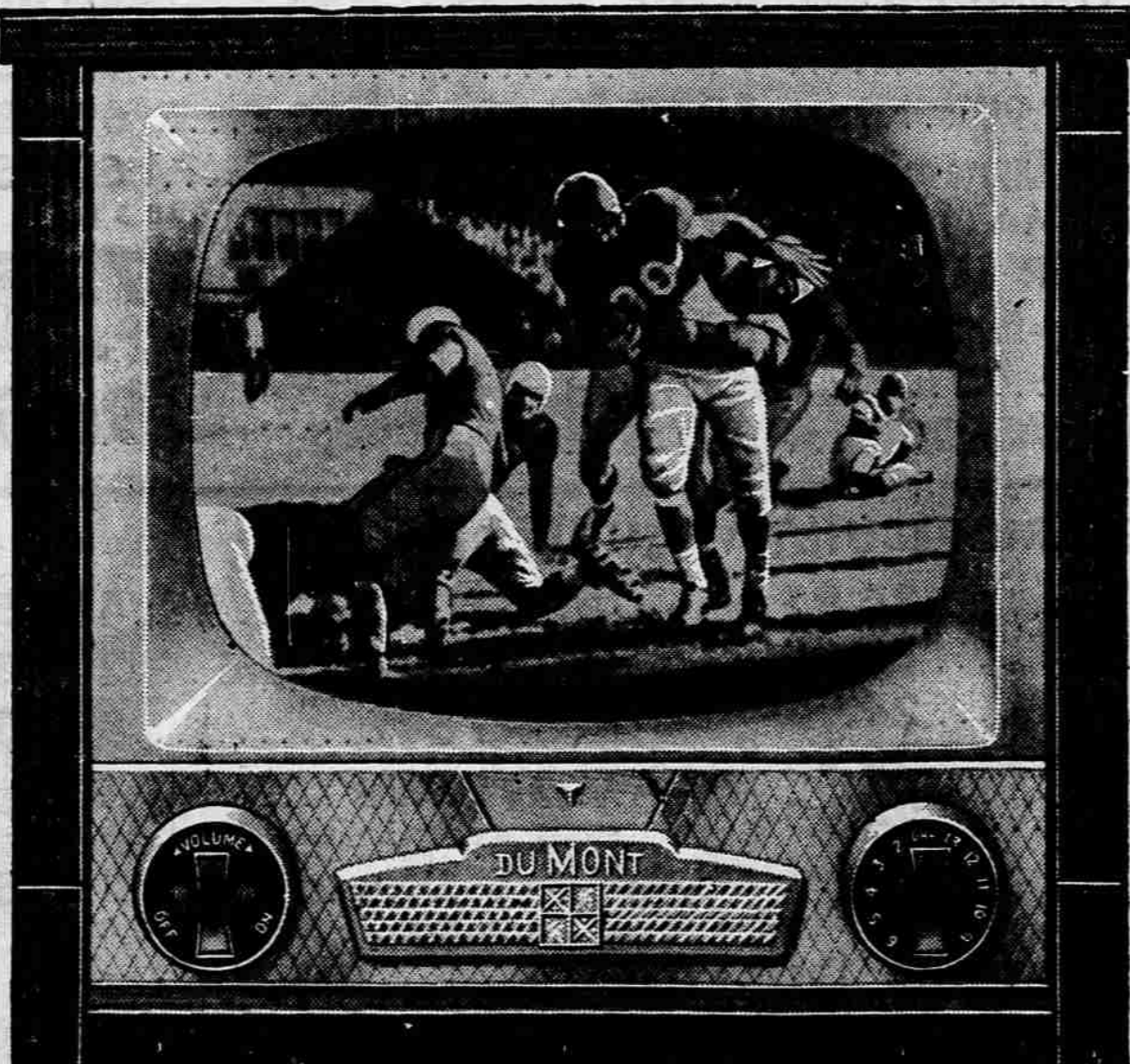
