Boy Shot Through Heart; Feeling 'Pretty Good'

North Bend, Ore. — (U.P.) — Fifteen-year-old Bob Wright of Hauser, who was shot through the heart in a hunting accident, was "feeling pretty good" today at Keizer hospital here.

The boy, his twin brother, Bill, and a friend, Gary Larsen, 15, were going hunting Sunday in a car when a .22 caliber rifle was jolted and discharged. The bullet struck Bob in the wrist and glanced off, piercing his chest and passing through his heart.

Doctors said the bullet apparently had slowed after striking the boy's wrist and made a clean wound in his heart. The boy was reported in good condition by hospital attendants.

Young Robinson Acquitted in Case

Santa Monica, Calif.—(U.P.)—Superior Judge Alan T. Lynch today dismissed two robbery counts against Edward G. Robinson Jr., son of the famed movie actor.

Robinson appeared in court with his attorney, Jerry Giesler, and heard the prosecution state it had acquired no new evidence in the case since last month when a jury voted 11-1 for acquittal. A retrial had been scheduled to open Feb. 14.

Robinson was arrested July 19 and charged with robbing two Hollywood cab drivers, one of them at gun point. Both victims tentatively identified Robinson as the man who robbed them. Robinson, however, contended they were mistaken and testified he was at his home in Westwood when the holdups took place.
