Wife Gives Up in Truck Stealing Case

San Francisco (U.P.)—Doloris Camp, 24, wife of an Idaho man charged with stealing \$100,000 worth of trucks to run an interstate transport business, went free without bail today after she gave herself up on charges of driving one of the vehicles across the state line.

Mrs. Camp, who has been living in Sonoma, Calif., surrendered voluntarily yesterday, but was released a short time later. Her husband, Donald Camp, 27, operated the Progressive Transport System with headquarters in Coeur d'Alene, Ida. He was arrested on a similar charge in Santa Rosa, Calif., Dec. 8.

The FBI said Camp admitted stealing 13 tractor and trailer rigs in California.

American Officers Quizzed on Fraulein

Wiesbaden, Germany (U.P.)—The U. S. Air Force announced today it is investigating the associations of high ranking officers with a comely fraulein who spied for the Russians.

A headquarters announcement said there is no indication the officers under investigation destroyed U. S. secrets to Irmgard M. Schmidt, but that some of them may be punished for "behaving improperly" with her.

An occupation court in Berlin yesterday sentenced the shapely brunette to prison for five years.

Persistent rumor linked her name with those of high ranking American civilians and military officers, but none of her companions was identified in court.

Pasadena Man Faces Four Murder Charges

Pasadena (U.P.)—Harold Oilar, 39, today faced four murder charges of hacking his wife and three young children to death with a Boy Scout axe while they slept after a Christmas party.

The counts were filed yesterday by Deputy District Atty. John W. Loucks. The Pasadena rug merchant, who went berserk with the axe early last Sunday morning, was a known morals offender, Loucks said.

Oilar, who tried unsuccessfully to commit suicide after the slayings and now is recovering in nearby Los Angeles General hospital, was accused of killing his wife, Blanche 39, and their children, Randolph, 12, Janet, 9, and Martha 7.

Police said the suspect is a writer of religious subjects, a dabbler in psychological theories and a student of metaphysics.

Manslaughter Charges Dismissed

Portland (U.P.)—Involuntary manslaughter charges against Donald S. Lehman, 20, Portland, were dismissed yesterday by Circuit Judge James R. Bain, who charged the prosecution failed to prove the youth was negligent in the accidental, fatal shooting of his wife.

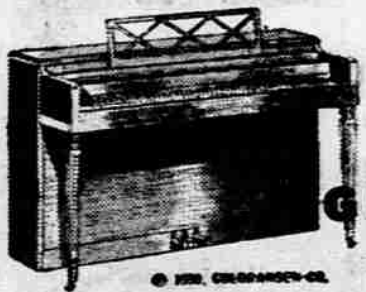
A coroner's jury found Lehman free of blame immediately after the shooting last June. The ex-Marine was later indicted by a grand jury, which charged him with involuntary manslaughter, Patricia Lehman, 16, was killed by a bullet from a .22 pistol which discharged while Lehman was cleaning it.

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
