All Comers Will Welcome Eggnog or Punch Refreshment

During the next ten days, throughout the holidays, the house will be jumping! Family and friends coming and going. And they'll all be thirsty! So, be prepared! We don't often indulge in exclamation marks but here they're really justified! Charming and gracious hosts and hostesses and their teen-age sons and daughters will have ready for all comers, a bowl or pitcher of the traditional holiday eggnog or one of the many colorful party punches.

Punch bowl or pitcher. If you don't happen to have a big punch bowl, it doesn't matter a whit. Use the biggest bowl in the house or pour from a pitcher. Small glasses however are desirable and can be stocked up if necessary at the nearest ten cent store. For informal entertaining, the buffet or any convenient table is fine. Your beverage together with thin slices of fruit cake, holiday cookies and salted nuts is quite adequate.

Lemonade Eggnog Family and King Size

An eggnog that is frothy and tasty, easy to make, uses the popular concentrate for lemonade which as you know is pure California lemon juice frozen with sugar. First, we give you the recipe for the family size for small bowl or pitcher filling:

6 eggs
3 6-ounce cans frozen concentrate for lemonade
1/2 cup powdered sugar
1 pint whole milk
1 pint heavy cream
Nutmeg

Beat egg yolks until thick and cream-colored. Add concentrate for lemonade. Beat egg whites until stiff and gradually add the powdered sugar to them while beating. Then combine the egg mixtures gradually and carefully stir in the milk, one-half cup at a time (use electric mixer if you have one, on low). Whip cream until stiff and fold into the egg-

nog mixture. Do not beat at this time. Serve the eggnog very cold with a dash of nutmeg on each serving. If you like, save a little of the egg white for putting a dab on top of each glass as served. A dash of nutmeg!

King Size Eggnog

Fine for planned party at home, church, club or other large gathering; makes 24 servings. Proceed exactly as for family size, using 12 eggs (separated) four 6-ounce cans frozen concentrate for lemonade, one cup powdered sugar, one quart whole milk, one quart heavy cream and of course nutmeg for sprinkling over top.

Cranberry Punches Both Hot and Cold

Here are fine punch recipes made with plentiful, inexpensive canned cranberry juice cocktail and with jellied cranberry sauce. Keep them handy.

Cheery Punch

This to be served over crushed ice or ice cubes; 25 servings. Combine three pints cranberry cocktail, three cups orange juice, 1 1/4 cups lemon juice and 1 1/2 cups pineapple juice. Mix well with 1 1/2 cups sugar and three cups water; pour over ice.

Cranberry Nog

For just the family, tree trimmers or other special occasion, this makes eight servings. Beat three egg yolks until light and fluffy. Add one-half cup milk and one pint cranberry juice cocktail. Beat until well blended. Add one-half teaspoon vanilla. Make meringue of the three egg whites and three tablespoons sugar. Fold into cranberry mixture just before serving.

Hot Buttered Punch

Traditional in many families. Dotted with butter, this usually is served with cinnamon stick stirrers. Makes 2 1/2 quarts for party serving or keep on hand for heating to boiling point as needed. Bring to boil three-fourths cup firmly packed brown sugar, one cup water, one-fourth teaspoon salt, one-fourth teaspoon nutmeg, one-half teaspoon cinnamon, one-half teaspoon allspice, three-fourths teaspoon cloves. Crush two one-pound cans jellied cranberry sauce with fork. Add three cups water and beat with rotary beater until smooth. Add cranberry liquid and one quart pineapple juice to hot spiced syrup and heat to boiling. Serve hot with nutmeg dash.

Turkey Roasting Done Differently Nowadays

We may seem to give this good advice often but it is so easy to roast a turkey to perfection every time by following these modern, up-to-date methods. Grandmother turned out a fine turkey, but modern methods are even better.

Over temperature at 325 degrees, no matter the size of the "turk". No need to worry about adjusting heat to size of bird; time varies of course with size of bird; time varying from 3 1/2 to five hours for oven-ready six to 12 pounds, five to six hours for oven-ready 12 to 16 pounds, six to 7 1/2 hours for 16 to 20 pounds and 7 to nine hours for 20 to 24 pounds.

Roast turkey on a rack in a shallow pan. Do not add water or cover the pan. To protect turkey from getting too brown or dry, many like to place a loose "tent" of aluminum foil over the bird or a piece of thin cloth moistened occasionally with fat. Use light touch when stuffing poultry. Do not pack or the result will be ditto.

Specialists advise 20 to 30 minutes out-of-the-oven waiting period before serving. Waiting period helps make the meat juicy and carving easier; gives proper time for gravy making and finishing-up. Bird will hold

heat so don't worry about that.

Men Like Appetizers That Have Real Zest

Women may like to fuss with fancy doodads when it comes to making appetizers, but give a man a chance and he'll fix up zesty ones like these.

Quick Dip

Begin with a good sharp cheese spread; add dashes of tobasco, a bit of horseradish, a fleck of curry powder and catsup to thin the mixture to dipping consistency. Tasting determines proper zip. Potato chips, corn chips and crisp crackers alongside; maybe celery.

Thuringer Picks

Quick and good are little cubes of Thuringer stuck on picks with a topping of pickled onion, stuffed olive or piece of dill pickle. Make lots of these.

Frank Fillers

Frankfurters, that is. These take a little fixing but are worth the effort. Slit frankfurters. Insert stick of cheese, cut in 1-inch pieces and wrap each piece in bacon. A pick holds all in place. Broil to heat and crisp bacon. Hold hot on grill or in hot dish.
