Tucson, Ariz. — (U.P.) — Jim (Shipwreck) Kelly, 74-year-old flagpole sitter, was in critical condition at Pima Hospital here today after suffering a heart attack while attempting to set a new world's record atop a pole in downtown Tucson.

Kelly, who claims a previous record atop the flagpole on the Denver Post building, came down from his perch last night after suffering the attack. He was found on the sidewalk in front of the building where the 18-inch square seat is located.

He had been on the perch just one hour short of four days.

Thousands Said Annual Victims of Snake Bites

Berkeley, Calif. — (U.P.) — Two scientists estimated today that between 30,000 and 40,000 persons throughout a large part of the world die each year as a result of bites from poisonous snakes.

This estimate came from Dr. S. Swaroop and B. Grab of the World Health organization in Geneva, Switzerland, in a paper read to the association for the Advancement of Science.

Syracuse Regains East Hoop Lead

The Syracuse Nationals' hopes of shaking off the New York Knickerbockers' challenge for first place in the Eastern division of the National Basketball association were buoyed today by the combination of a last-minute victory and a favorable schedule.

The Nationals regained first place Sunday night by beating the Knicks, 97-92, in overtime after tying the score at 85-85 on Earl Lloyd's field goal with three seconds remaining. The Knickerbockers must play four more games this week including road contests with Rochester and Boston.

Frank Brian scored 31 points to lead the Fort Wayne Pistons to a 109-106 triumph over the Philadelphia Warriors and the Minneapolis Lakers held Bob Cousy to 12 points in beating the Celtics, 87-82, in other games.

Buckeye Coach Woody Hayes said his star halfback, Howard Hopalong Cassidy, would play that injured backfield stars in the football classic despite a rib injury suffered in a heavy scrimmage Friday.

Moreover, fullback Hubert Bobo, who has been out of heavy Ohio State drills since the Big Ten champions arrived here more than a week ago, also returned to practice.

Take Wraps Off "I'll take the wraps off Hubie today," Hayes said, "and put him through a little contact work to see just how good his knee is."

Southern California Coach Jess Hill learned that sophomore tailback sensation Jon Arnett was not hurt seriously when he twisted his knee.

Hill said he planned no more

scrimmages for the Trojans.

"We are about as ready as we can get," he said. "So it would be foolish to risk injuries or staleness by too much work this week. If nothing else happens, all the players will be ready for the game."

Hayes said his Buckeyes also are ready and that from now on his problem is "to keep them that way."
