Time Won't Remove Cause of Tantrums

One of the most common fallacies in child-rearing is the belief that a youngster will "outgrow" undesirable forms of behavior. A mother writes:

(Q) "I have three children, 4, 3 and 1. My four-year-old son is the one I am worried about. I treat my three children the same; they all get

love and affection from my husband and me. But my son goes into a tantrum if I ask him a question sometimes or tell him that he shouldn't do things. He jumps up and down, then sits on the floor, screams and kicks his feet. We don't know what to do. Everyone says he will outgrow it, but still we worry. What is your opinion?"

(A) I agree with your friends, but within limits. Your son will "outgrow" his tantrums. He will stop jumping up and down and screaming. When he is old enough to go to school he will discover that other children think such behavior is "babyish" and will make fun of him.

That, however, is as far as my agreement with your friend's opinion goes. Just because your son stops his babyish tantrums will not mean that he has outgrown his anger and resentments.

Instead, he will express them in a more grown-up way. He will sulk, be grouchy or sarcastic and make himself generally disagreeable. His tantrums will simply have to take another form.

Find out why he gets so angry; then try to correct the cause. Since he is the oldest of your children, he may resent being treated like the younger ones. Give him more responsibilities and privileges, and treat him as the oldest child. See if this does not do the trick.

The late great William Jennings Bryan, for whom I voted, although my father begged me to keep it secret, for if the public became aware of my defection, it might ruin my career, didn't get roars of laughter, Bryan's advocacy of grape juice or other non-alcoholic beverage for formal toasts and social drinking brought the man ridicule and invective, uttered by wine-bibbers under the influence or by professionals in the pay of the wine or liquor interests.

Not that I'd vote for a man merely because he's an abstainer, although I admire any man in public life who knows alcohol never does anyone any good, and has sufficient self-respect to decline, more or less politely according to the situation, to take a drink in any circumstance, and enough concern for the welfare of the country and the happiness of the people to advocate teetotalism.

that the drunks get home safely when the party is over there will be the usual number of tragic traffic accidents.

The studies of Drs. Strongin and Winsor of Cornell University have established the sobering effect of coffee.
