Blow-up Bolsters

New York—(U.P.)—You now can buy bolsters which retain their shape without being "plumped up" after every use.

The new bolsters, made of vinyl plastic, are inflatable, lightweight, air-tight and can be wiped clean with a sudsy cloth. The bolsters can be deflated for easy storage. Designed for use as is under a bedspread, or to be covered for use on bed or couch, the bolsters come in two sizes—36 inch or 54 inch lengths.
