TOO MUCH HEART TROUBLE IN THE HEAD

In reference to pain or distress wrongly attributed to the heart and disturbances of heart function Dr. J. A. Oille, Canadian internist, said: "Almost 60 per cent of patients who consult a cardiac specialist are suffering either from an exaggerated or wholly unnecessary anxiety about their hearts, arising from suggestion and not based on reason..."

Out of 631 persons referred to the Work Classification Unit in New York because of employment difficulties attributed to heart disease, 175 were found to have no heart disease at all. Weak heart is popular with neurotics, responsibility and work evaders, chiselers, draft dodgers and free loaders.

Most of the suggestions arise from careless or ill-considered remarks by doctors. If the trouble is just weak heart the cure is simple and certain—graduated exercise, that is gradually increasing daily stints of exercise, play or work over
