Security Suggested For Delinquents

Chicago—(U.P.)—Banning comic books and blaming parents is too easy and fruitless a way out of the problems of juvenile delinquency, the Journal of the American Medical association said today in an editorial.

"The delinquent youth has been described as a rebel without a cause," the editorial said. "He is essentially an unhappy person who is looking for a face-saving way to abandon his false bravado. He does not conform to the standards of a society from which he feels he has been excluded."

"If we want the delinquent to adjust to society we must recognize the importance of providing the sort of security to which a person may reasonably be expected to adjust," the editorial said.
