Chicago — (U.P.) — Jack Webb, television's Sgt. Joe Friday, married blonde actress Dorothy Towne in a private ceremony today.

The wedding was held in a penthouse apartment at the Ambassador East hotel. It was the second marriage for each.

Webb, 34, who flew into town with his 25-year-old fiancée Sunday night and took out a marriage license only yesterday, said Miss Towne plans to settle down to being "just a housewife."

"She never took this acting career seriously at all," he said.

Webb's first marriage to actress Julie London, mother of his two children, ended in divorce in 1953.

Miss Towne, who comes from El Paso, Tex., had her marriage to cafe owner Leo Ravich annulled when she discovered his divorce from his first wife was not final.

Second String Reds Ordered Arrested

New York — (U.P.) — Orders went out today for the arrest of 13 second string Communists sentenced two years ago for teaching or advocating the overthrow of the U.S. government by force.

Federal Judge Irving R. Kaufman issued warrants for arrest of the Reds Monday after the U.S. Supreme court in Washington refused to review their conviction.

Judge Kaufman ordered their bail of \$25,000 each revoked and ruled that they must begin serving their sentences.

The 13 Communists were sentenced on Jan. 21, 1953, to serve one to three years each and pay fines from \$2,000 to \$6,000.

Japanese Premier Eyes Peace With Russ

Osaka, Japan — (U.P.) — Premier Ichiro Hatoyama said today Japan probably will initiate peace negotiations with Russia and Red China within the next two months.

"It is reasonable for Japan to want to normalize relations with Russia and Communist China," Hatoyama said during a stop-over on a campaign tour.

"Japan should take the initiative and issue a call to those countries before the general elections in late February or early March."

The two Red-run nations, which boycotted the San Francisco Peace Treaty, are still technically at war with Japan.

Plane Passengers Fed

Vancouver, B.C. — (U.P.) — Canadian Pacific Airlines reported today it had to feed some of its Trans-Pacific passengers live ants and raw herring.

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Final arguments were expected to begin today at the trial of meat packer George A. Hormel II on charges of possessing narcotics.

A narcotics squad officer testified yesterday that the young jazz musician admitted "taking a puff" on a marijuana cigarette the night he was arrested for allegedly having 13 marijuana cigarettes hidden in his car.

John O'Grady, city narcotics officer, said Hormel's confession came when he demanded that the meat packer undergo a chemical test to determine if he had been smoking marijuana.

The defense has contended Hormel was "framed" when O'Grady and other officers arrested him Sept. 18.

TOO MANY FEATHERS Wethersfield, Conn. — (U.P.) — Edward D. Layton of Harrington, Del., was arrested last night on charges of driving an overloaded truck. State police said Layton's truck carried 31,000 pounds of feathers.

Election of President in French Assembly May Weaken Premier

Paris — (U.P.) — A major political assault aimed at undermining the strength of Premier Pierre Mendes-France begins in the National Assembly today while the Premier is engaged in a series of important conferences in Rome.

The battle is for the presidency of the divided National Assembly. The past is now held by Socialist Andre Le Troquer, a supporter of Mendes-France who seeks reelection in the new session of Parliament. The Communists and the extreme right wing will try to seat their own man.

Mendes-France, fresh from a four-day vacation in southern Italy, began a busy two days in Rome with a morning conference with Italian Budget Minister Ezio Vanoni.

Later in the day he meets Premier Mario Scelba and Foreign Minister Gaetano Martino in conferences informed sources said were aimed at selling Italians his pet idea of a European arms pool.

The National Assembly met to elect a successor to the one-armed Le Troquer. Three ballots were scheduled and the results were not expected until late evening.

Pushes Arms Pool — Meanwhile Mendes-France was expected to make an all out effort to sway Italy into the French arms pool camp before he heads north for talks with West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer at Baden Baden. Italy was reported favorably inclined, Adenauer opposed.

A Foreign Office spokesman at the Hague said Monday night Holland was "almost definitely opposed" to Mendes-France's plan for an arms pool. Britain and Germany were the chief opponents with Holland, Belgium and Luxembourg cool.

The battle for the presidency of the National Assembly may foreshadow other battles over such issues as the French budget, home rule for Tunisia and a new electoral system that will deter-

mine the fate of Mendes-France's government.

Test of Strength Seen — The election was expected to develop into a test of strength between the left of center majority that backs the Premier and the right of center group that opposes him as bitterly as do the Communists.

The Mendes-France majority of Socialists, Radicals and Gaullists first emerged last year in electing Le Troquer to the office which is the second highest protocol office in the land and ranks only after that of President Rene Coty.

The Communists joined the Mendes group then but this year the Communists and the followers of Gen. Charles de Gaulle are expected to vote against the Premier's group. The Communists and Gaullists hold the balance of power in the divided Assembly.

Mendes-France is not directly involved in today's battle but a Le Troquer defeat would undermine the Premier's political authority since it would threaten his majorities.

FEELS HUSBAND SPENDS MORE THAN HIS SHARE

The family income belongs to the whole family, not to one member alone. When one member wants more than his share the others are bound to resent it.

(Q) "When we were first married, my husband handled the money. Big joke! He spent it without knowing where it went, and the bills didn't get paid. I had to take over the management of the money. I managed to save enough for a down payment on a home. Today he earns \$125 a week. Sounds like a lot, doesn't it? After paying taxes, bills, insurance, etc., my husband takes \$20 a week, not for clothes or gas or anything like that. Those are paid out of the family budget. Every two weeks I take a trip to the city and have my hair washed and set. That is my sole expenditure for myself. I don't smoke or drink, and I never have enough money from the budget for anything else for myself. I feel that my husband is getting more than his share."

(A) You do not say what your husband does with the \$20 a week he keeps. Does he use it for lunches, transportation and gifts for you and the house, or does he just "blow it in" and have nothing to show for it?

You should have more money for your own needs and wishes than you have, considering your husband's income.

While it is nice to have one's hair washed and set professionally, couldn't you save that money by doing it yourself except for special occasions?

Ask your husband to keep a complete record of every cent he spends every week for a month or two. Then you and he can go over his expenditures together to see if they are really justified. If they are not, another arrangement should be made about the spending money each of you keeps for your personal use. Unless you look into this matter and see where the money actually goes, you will continue to feel that your husband is getting more than his share of the family income, and you will naturally resent it.
