Your Health and Its Care

Some courageous citizen, attending a panel discussion of something or other by doctors at the B'nai B'rith forum arose and asked the doctors for an opinion of Dr. Brady. A doctor on the panel said "Brady is very amusing, better than the funny papers."

That's what I have been telling you folks for years. I don't know what the panel doctor's specifications for a quack may be, but according to Webster a quack is one who professes knowledge in any matter of which he knows little or nothing. That's Brady, all right. Maybe I don't come right out and pretend to know better than other doctors do, except when it ob-

vious they are all out of step but Brady. In private practice you can get away with mur—you can quack it most of the time if you wish, and nobody will raise a rumpus about it save an occasional victim who, aided and abetted by one of your competitors . . . of course your malpractice defense insurance takes care of such annoyances.

In print everything you say in reference to medicine, surgery and the steadily increasing number of full time or part time specialties is carefully reviewed by thousands of medical critics like the panel doctor quoted above. If your opinion or teaching does not coincide with what he or his coterie favors this season you are ipso facto a quack.

One newspaper editor, referring to the forum panel's member's assertion that Brady is amusing, better than the funny papers and a quack, recalls that Brady from time to time refers to himself facetiously as a quack. I realize now that I shouldn't have. The editor is right, though it is not always facetiously. Consciously or not, when I make a positive or negative assertion pertaining to health in this column—as I do nearly every day—and forget, or purposely neglect to explain that it is just my belief or opinion or the view of this or that clearly identified

authority—I am quacking it within the Websterian sense of the word. Had I not acknowledged that I am a quack, I might have a lot of fun now suing the B'nai B'rith panel doctor for slander or something—his malpractice defense insurance probably wouldn't cover the damages I might win in such an action. But, darn it, how can you sue a man, or even blame him, for telling the truth? For that matter, if the panel doctor were in my place and in his, I don't believe I'd stop at calling him a quack.

Revival Program Enters 30th Year On Air This Month Dr. Charles E. Fuller, pioneer radio pulpiteer, this month enters his 30th year of continuous broadcasting.

The "Old Fashioned Revival Hours, which Fuller directs, is the oldest network religious program on the air today. From a modest beginning over a single California station, this program is now heard on hundreds of stations around the world each week. It is carried by station KYJC here each Sunday from 1 to 2 p.m. The network audience is estimated at 10,000,000 persons.

One of the first to enter the field of religious radio, Dr. Fuller realized in 1925, while the minister of a small church in southern California, that there were millions who never attended church. Through the medium of radio he saw the tremendous possibilities of reaching these same people with a religious service where they are—at home, in their automobile, in hospitals, in prisons, in light-houses, in airplanes, on ships at sea, and during battle.

In 1949 the "Old Fashioned Revival Hour" began broadcasting over the ABC network, in addition to the hundreds of other stations a ready carrying the program by transcription. The growth of coverage has been phenomenal, until now there is scarcely an area in America—and in many foreign countries—where this Sunday hour cannot be heard.
