

Seminary Sunday Observance Set

Attention of the Episcopal church throughout the nation will be focused Sunday on the work and needs of the church's theological seminaries. Known as "Seminary Sunday, every congregation will be informed on the current status of our seminaries, the supply of prospective clergy, the financial situation in theological education, and other matters.

Where possible students from theological colleges will be guest preachers at church services. Visiting at Saint Mark's Episcopal church here will be Don Eaton, a senior classman at the Church Divinity School of the Pacific at Berkeley, Calif. Eaton who will address the Adult Study group at 9:30 a.m. and preach at the 11 a.m. service, is one of this year's outstanding students, and a candidate for the ministry from the Episcopal Diocese of Oregon.

He will be accompanied by Mrs. Eaton, and a coffee hour will be held following the 11 a.m. service in honor of the couple. The special offering will be devoted to the work of the Berkeley seminary.

Prospect Church To Be Dedicated

Prospect — Dedication of the Church of the Good Shepherd is planned for Sunday at 3 p.m., when the bishop of the Episcopal diocese of Oregon, the Rt. Rev. Benjamin Dagwell, Portland, will officiate.

The mission, begun by the congregation of St. Mark's church in Medford, now is equipped with a new church building and vicarage, and is ministering to a wide group of residents in the Prospect and Shady Cove vicinities.

The Medford church shares the support of the project with the diocese of Oregon. The Rev. Robert L. Greene is the vicar.

Second in Series Sunday at Nazarene

"Christ and Temptation" will be the topic of the second in a series on the subject of temptation which will be given Sunday by the Rev. Raymond W. Hurn, pastor of the Church of Nazarene at First and Holly sts. He opened the series last Sunday. During the morning worship service the congregation will observe a quarterly communion.

Other subjects which will be in the series include, "Temptation and Desire," and "How to Conquer Temptation." The series is to conclude Sunday, Feb. 6.

Next Sunday the choir will sing at the morning service and Sunday evening the evangelistic hour will include music by the church orchestra, a male chorus and the church choir. A 30-minute sing-along by those who attend also will be conducted. Dr. G. A. Dierdorff will be guest soloist.

Famed Renaissance Painting in Museum

Providence, R. I. — (U.P.) — A famous Renaissance painting that was retouched by a British painter, is now the property of the Rhode Island School of Design's museum.

The museum purchased the painting, Nicolas Poussin's "Venus and Adonis," after it turned up in a private English collection last summer. Dr. John Maxon, museum director, called the purchase the museum's "most important... in 20 years."

Poussin's work, "lost" for more than a century, was once the property of Sir Joshua Reynolds, the famed English painter.

"When Sir Joshua owned it, he somewhat repainted the canvas," Dr. Maxon said. "But his repaints have been successfully removed and Poussin's original work has survived in unusually fine condition."

Battleship Oregon Funeral Unworkable

Portland — (U.P.) — Harry E. Williams, chairman of the Battleship Oregon Commission, has returned from conferences with the Navy department in Washington convinced that plans for a full military funeral for the famed ship are unworkable.

"The burial is just a hopeless situation," Williams said. "I had several conferences with the secretary of the Navy and his aides and they said it would take a special act of Congress."

Episcopal Church Purchases Property; Officers Elected

St. Mark's Episcopal church has purchased the property of the Medford Christian Science church, it was announced at a congregational meeting of St. Mark's last Sunday evening.

The property is located adjacent to St. Mark's Sunday school building on South Oakdale ave. The transfer of the property will be completed next month.

The results of a fund drive, conducted last summer and fall to raise money which made the purchase possible, also were announced. More than \$125,000 has been given or pledged so far, the announcement said.

Considerable growth in communicant strength also was revealed and growth was evident in reports of all parish organizations. An increase of activity in various departments was indicated.

The building just acquired will be used to increase church school facilities until another structure can be erected.

The gift of Black Oaks estates to the Episcopal diocese of Oregon by Mrs. Alan J. Lowrey of San Francisco also was announced at this meeting.

Discussed were plans for a new hospital in Medford, announced earlier, which will replace the present Community hospital which is owned by the Episcopal church.

During elections Messrs. Elwood C. Hedberg, Shelby M. Tuttle, Frank C. Bash and Fred Morlan were selected to succeed the Messrs. H. H. Coleman, John P. Moffat, Robert A. Elliott and Eric Allen Jr., for three-year terms of service on the vestry.

Delegates to the diocesan convention for which St. Mark's congregation will be hosts April 17 and 19, were named. The delegates are Tuttle, James A. McDougall, Fred J. Carr, Art Morlan.

Alternate delegates are Robert W. Voegtly, Robert S. Rix, Robert D. Dames, and Victor Milnes. The Rev. George R. V. Bolster, who presided at the

meeting announced the appointment of Miss Jane Snedcor as parish correspondent to the Diocesan and National church press.
