Ashland Elks Plan Lounge Addition

Ashland—Plans for a construction program, to add a large area to the present Elks building in downtown Ashland, has been announced by the Elks lodge here.

The plan calls for using the site of the former Lithia theater destroyed by fire a few years ago, on which to build a concrete structure as an addition to the present building. The addition would be used as a lounge.

Cost estimates run to about \$40,000 to \$50,000. The lodge authorized its officers to spend up to \$50,000 for building and equipment. Approval of the state Elks association is being sought, so work can begin as soon as possible, and perhaps be completed in time for a state Elks meeting scheduled here in June.
