Atom-Powered Sub Has Rubber Ears. Akron, O.—(U.P.)—The world's first atom-powered submarine has rubber ears. The rubber was specially developed by E. F. Goodrich here to permit sound waves to pass through it in about the same manner as sound travels through the sea itself. It's used as a part of the hull of the U.S. Navy submarine, Nautilus, to house sonar gear that depends on sound waves to detect other surface or undersea craft.
