CALORIES IN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Immediately after the holiday season the mail brought numerous inquiries concerning the number of calories or "food value" of alcoholic beverages.

The alcoholic beverage is a source of energy. But capacity to burn alcohol in the body is limited. If more alcohol is taken than the body can burn to produce heat or muscular energy, the excess merely intoxicates and impairs both mental and physical efficiency.

Now if you suspect I'm a (insert appropriate adjectives) teetotal abstainer your suspicion is well founded, and if you think I'm rabid on the subject of alcoholic indulgence you're right again. You want to make anything of this?

According to Food and Beverage Analysis by M. A. Bridges, B. S., M. D., F. A. C. P., (Lea & Febiger) various kinds of beer yield from 100 to 135 to the glass—a standard measuring cupful A glass (wineglassful, about 3 1/2 ounces) of champagne 90 calories, port wine 165 calories, Rhine wine, 70 calories, claret 60 calories. A glass (brandy glass, 3 cc, about an ounce) of brandy 70 calories, Bourbon or rye whiskey 85 calories, hard cider 40 calories.
