In village or small town papers through out the country he printed a testimonial from a (b l a n k) nurse, minister, lawyer, teacher or whatnot, the language of which was identical in every instance, but the name of the local town or village was inserted in the blank space to make the testimonial seem genuine.

While boys of today do not prefer girls to be "beautiful but dumb," as boys of the past generations did, they still do not like girls to show off their knowledge and make them feel inferior.

(Q) "I am in my second year of high school and am very fond of a certain boy who is in my class. I think he likes me too, but he is very shy and doesn't show it. He is not a very good student and has been having a lot of trouble with his French. I like French and always get good grades in it. I would like to help this boy with his lessons, but I am not sure if I should offer to do so. How do you think he would feel about it?"

(A) He would doubtless be very glad to have your help, but you will have to go about it in a very tactful way if you want him to like you.

It is humiliating to a boy to know that a girl thinks he is not very bright. You would certainly convey that impression if you offered to help him without his asking you.

You could, however, lead up to the matter gradually in conversations. In time he might even ask you if you would help him. Be sure to emphasize that you like languages and have always been good in them, then quickly add that you haven't the "brains" to do math, science, or some other subject in which you know he is fairly good. True, you may be better in this subject than he is, but don't let him know that you know it.

This might be the clue for him to ask you to help him, and he will offer, in turn, to help you with the subject you are having difficulties with. In that way, you will give him a chance to feel superior to you in at least one subject.

A boy who is shy has to be handled with kid gloves. He retreats into his shell very quickly if he suspects a person is superior to him. Give him a chance to feel that he is brighter than you.

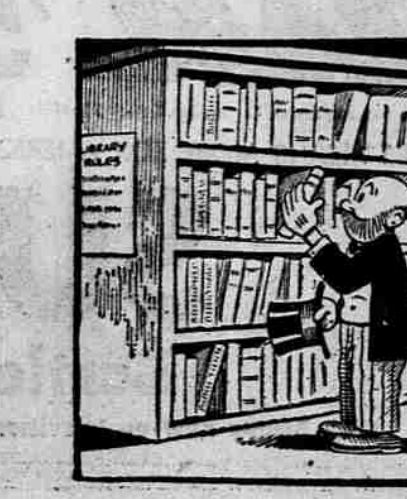
