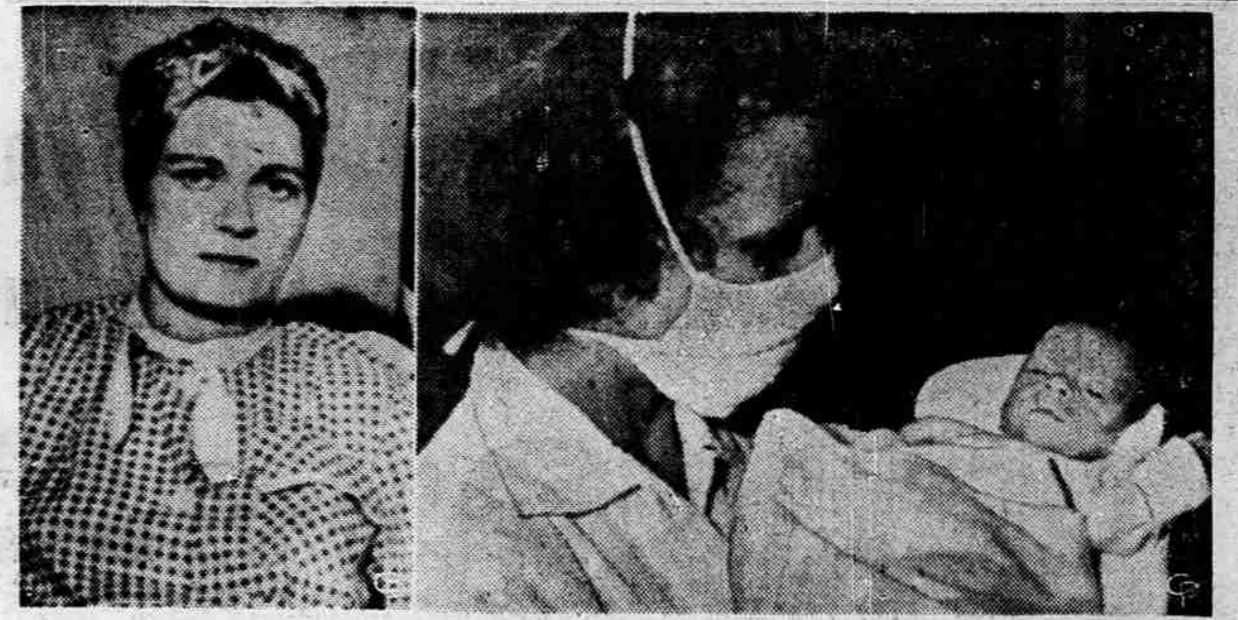

**Two Small Children Die in Cabin Fire**  
 Olathe, Kan. — (U.P.)—Two small children lost their lives in a cabin fire at Gardner Lake, southwest of here, late yesterday. The victims were three-year-old Peter John La Miranda and his 22-month-old sister, Linda.

They were the children of Mr. and Mrs. Peter J. La Miranda Sr. The father is an airman first class with the 2472nd reserve flying center at the Olathe Naval Air Base.

His home was listed as Bend, Ore. The parents were not at home when the fire broke out. The father rushed from a nearby tavern where he was working as a partime employee and attempted to rescue the children but was driven back by flames.

**Motion of Acquittal Denied for Dodele**

Hillsboro, Ore. — (U.P.)—Circuit Judge Arlie G. Walker yesterday afternoon denied a defense motion for a directed verdict of acquittal in the first-degree murder trial of Jerry Dodele.

The state's case was concluded after the judge ruled a second statement by the 17-year-old Timber youth was admissible. In the unsigned statement, Dodele admitted pulling the trigger of a .22-calibre rifle which allegedly killed a 64-year-old Timber railroad mechanic, Peter Ribbers, in the latter's home on Nov. 11.

Defense Attorney Irvin Goodman brought out during cross examination of witnesses that Jerry said in his second statement that he had pulled the trigger accidentally.

**Farm Price Outlook Claimed Encouraging**

Washington — (U.P.) — Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson said today the farm price outlook now is "encouraging." He said it would be "a grave and costly mistake" to repeal the administration's flexible farm price support program and restore rigid high supports for basic crops.

Testifying before the House Agriculture Committee, Benson also warned against any move to legislate an increase in dairy price supports five per cent would cost taxpayers \$125,000,000, he said.

"Dairy surpluses are declining," he said, and "this is not time to rock the boat."

**Submarine Used To Refuel Flying Boat**

Washington — (U.P.) — A flying boat has been refueled from a submarine for the first time, the Navy announced today. The feat points the way to a new type of sea-based striking power.

The seaplane-submarine combination was seen as a future adjunct of carrier forces for hit and run tactics against special enemy targets.

A Navy spokesman told a reporter that the test took place in the first week of February off San Juan, Puerto Rico.

**Nevada Representative Undergoes Minor Surgery**

Washington — (U.P.) — Rep. Clifton Young (R-Nev.) is in the Naval Medical Center at nearby Bethesda, Md., recovering from "minor surgery," his office reported today.

Young entered the hospital Monday, and is expected to be released next Monday.
