Stuff Frankfurters With Savory Kraut
New fillip for an old favorite. In this tasty combination, the frankfurters are chutney-stuffed and baked; the kraut combined with onion, caraway seed and catsup. Verrry good!

2 frankfurters
2 strips of cheese
8 slices bacon
1 No. 303 can sauerkraut (2 cups)
1/4 teaspoon caraway seed
2 tablespoons finely chopped onion
1/2 cup catsup
3 tablespoons brown sugar

Combine kraut with last four ingredients and simmer covered for 20 minutes. Split each frankfurter lengthwise without cutting all the way through. Fill slits with cheese and wrap frankfurters with bacon, fastening each end with toothpicks. Bake on a rack in a shallow pan at 425 degrees for about 15 minutes or until bacon is cooked to desired crispness. Serve kraut topped with stuffed frankfurters. Four generous servings.

Fish Fillet Chowder
Satisfying chowder for six servings to family home at lunch or for suppers. Cut one pound any favored fish fillets into one inch pieces. Fry one-quarter chopped bacon or salt pork until lightly browned. Add one-half cup chopped onion and cook until tender. Add two cups hot water, one cup diced raw potatoes, three-quarter teaspoon salt, dash of pepper and the fish. Cook about 15 minutes or until potatoes and fish are tender. Add two cups milk; reheat. Garnish with chopped parsley.

Date Cup Cakes
Served Upside Down
It is Date Festival time in India, heart of California's Coachella valley, where grow the only commercial crop of dates grown in the United States. Here is a truly different kind of cup cake, filled with chevy goodness and served upside down. Very quickly made and baked.

Sift and measure one-half cup sifted flour together with one-half teaspoon baking powder, one-quarter teaspoon salt onto a paper; add one-half cup chopped fresh pitted dates and one-half cup chopped walnuts and set aside. Beat two eggs in mixing bowl. Add one-half teaspoon vanilla; then gradually beat in one cup (firmly packed) brown sugar. Stir in flour and fruit and mix well. Fill well-greased tin muffin pans not more than two-thirds full and bake in moderate hot oven, 375 degrees, about 15 minutes. Cool on rack, then store tightly covered. Do not frost. Twenty-four cup cakes.

Canned Red Cherries
American Favorite
For the past 25 years, members of the cherry canning industry in this country have united in sponsoring National Cherry Week just ahead of Washington's birthday. Parson Weems certainly started something when he had young G. Washington chop down that cherry tree.

Cherries are a favorite with American cooks for making pies, tarts, cakes and custards. The canned tart red pie cherry is enjoyed the year around. These recipes use one No. 2 can.

Cherry Nut Custard
Combine two-thirds cup sugar, one-half cup flour, one-quarter teaspoon salt. Add two cups scalded milk gradually. Cook 15 minutes in double boiler, stirring constantly until mixture thickens and afterward stir occasionally. Add two slightly beaten eggs and cook two or three minutes longer. Cool and fold in one teaspoon vanilla or almond extract, one No. 2 can red tart pitted cherries and one-half cup broken nut meats. Serve with cookies. Six generous servings.

Cherry Apple Cobbler
For the crust, use any favored baking powder biscuit dough or mix. Divide dough; press a layer of dough into a greased baking dish; add filling (recipe below) and top with remaining dough. Bake at 400 degrees about 25 minutes or until crust is brown and filling tender.

Cobbler Filling. Combine one cup sugar and three tablespoons enriched flour; mix well with one (drained) can red tart pitted cherries (saving the juice for the Foamy Sauce recipe) combined with two cups cooking apples sliced as for pie.

Cherry Foam Sauce. Combine one cup tart red cherry juice and one cup sugar. Cook to a thick syrup; then pour slowly over two stiffly beaten egg whites. Add one-half teaspoon almond flavoring and a few drops of red vegetable coloring to make desired shade. Serve hot or cold as sauce for topping for cobbler or save for serving with any plain cake. Eight servings.

Quick Casserole. Heat canned chili con carne (without beans) to simmering. Put 2 1/2 cups cooked large dry lima beans in small casserole. Cover with heated chili and top with one-quarter cup grated American cheese. Heat in moderate oven for 20 minutes.

Pears, Grapefruit, Eggs, Rice, Pork, Fish Among Plentifuls
Seasonal supplies of famed western d'anjou pears continue to keep this tempting winter

fruit on many shopping lists along with plentiful fresh and processed grapefruit and oranges. Available from October to May, "Anjou" pears are at their best now and continue to be good values through March. Flesh is white, highly perfumed and has a rich spicy flavor.

Citrus fruits are the big bargain in needed vitamin C. Quality is excellent now. When you shop for oranges or grapefruit consider fruit that is firm and heavy for its size for flavor and juice; thin skinned for its variety for a juicy fruit; pleasing odor free from mold of soft spots for fresh flavor. Store both grapefruit and oranges at refrigerator temperature keeping them in large enough space to let the air circulate freely about them.

Egg supplies continue large with rising production holding prices down. Eggs for breakfast! Rice is plentiful for enjoying as vegetable change; makes fine puddings.

Canned snap beans pack is extra large and that means lower prices. Combine green beans with one of the good mushroom sauces for a vegetable change. Canned sweet corn pack also is way above average. Canned corn is so good just seasoned with butter, salt and pepper. Makes fine puddings and soufs, too. Watch for specials. Put in supplies now.

Meat Supplies. Both beef and pork continue in very good supply with good eating at low cost in a wide variety of economy cuts. Economical pork roasts are cut from the end of the loin. The loin and roast nearest the shoulder is known as the blade loin roast and that nearest the ham section is the pork sirloin roast. Both are prepared same as expensive cuts except that longer cooking is required. Roast fat-side up, in moderate, 325 degree oven, 45 to 50 minutes to the pound. Give pork roast gourmet touch by rubbing generously with sage or caraway seed before roasting. Try pork shoulder steaks, hearty ham hocks or barbecued pork spare ribs.

Fish department good buys include frozen haddock fillets, frozen halibut, shrimp both fresh and frozen... and canned tuna.
