A special program will be presented by the Girl Scouts of Troop 16, Washington school.

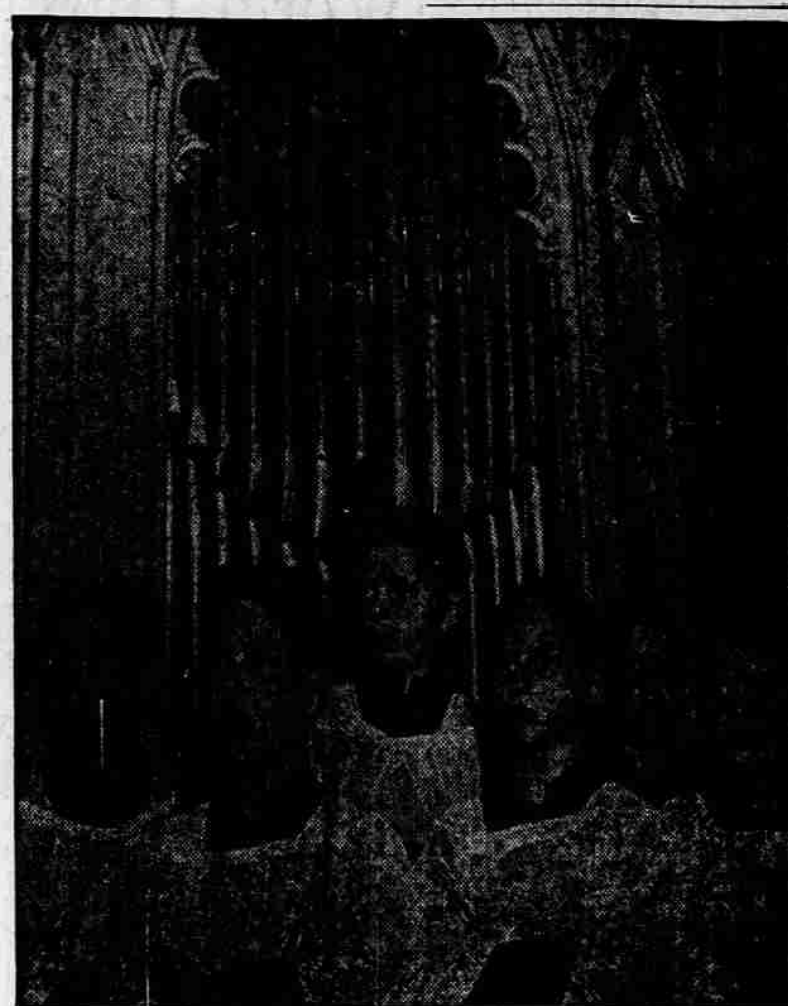

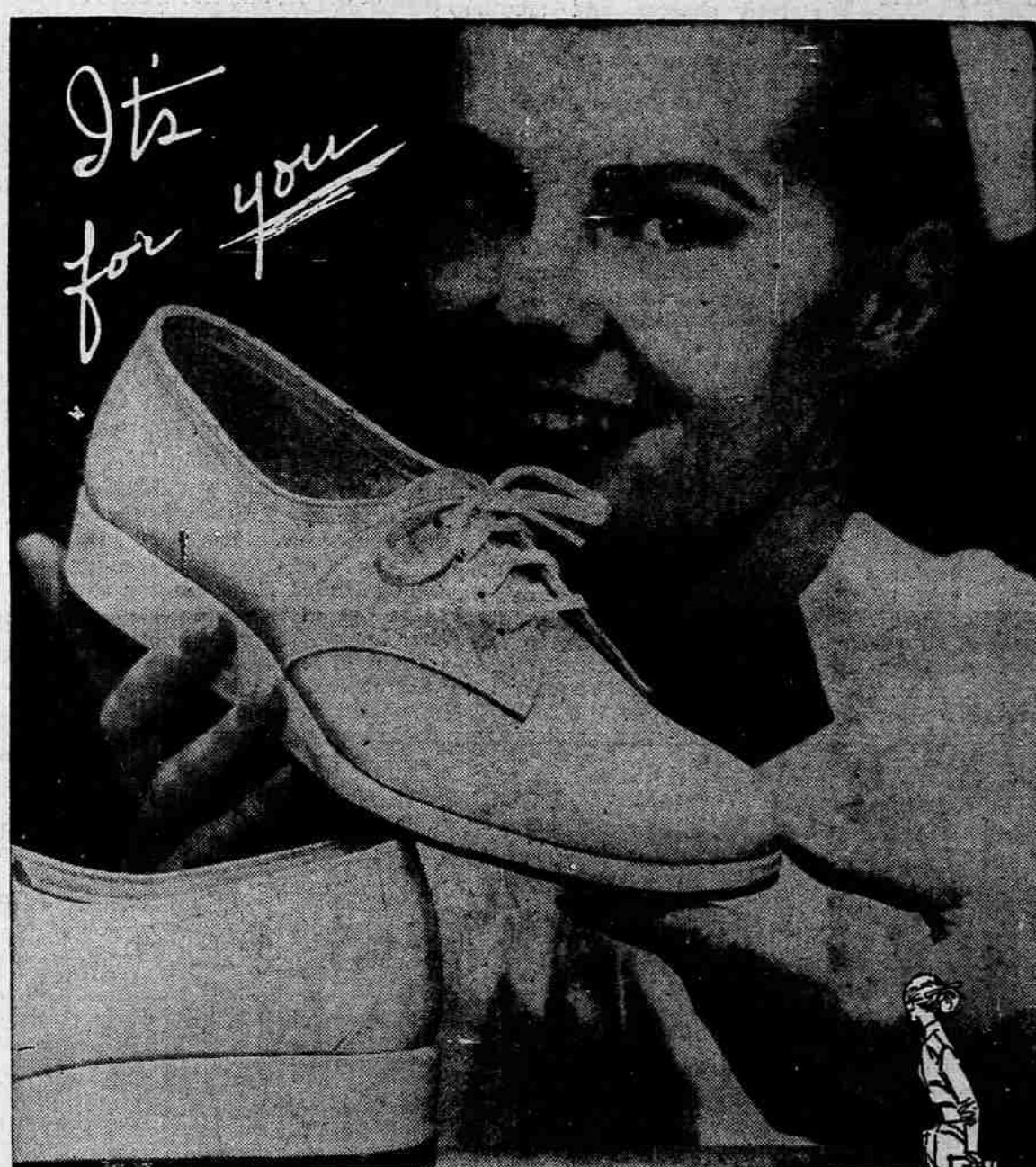
