**Two Rug Classes**

The braided rug course will have two classes. Class one will begin Thursday, Mar. 3, in the cafeteria of Medford high school from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. The second class will start later the same day from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. Mrs. Aronda Frink is instructor for both classes. Registration fee is \$3.

Tailoring will also have two classes, including 12 class sessions during a six-week period. Class one will meet Monday and Thursday afternoon, beginning Feb. 28 and Mar 3 from 1 to 4 p.m. Location will be the housing project recreation room at McAndrews rd. and Priddy st.
