CAB To Investigate New Mexico Crash

Albuquerque, N. M. —(U.P.)—The Civil Aeronautics Board starts its investigation today into the crash of a Trans-World airliner in the Sandia mountains Saturday, killing 13 passengers and its three member crew.

Phil Goldstein, CAB investigator from California, and TWA General Operations Manager Frank Busom of Kansas City are due here today to check the instruments. It was believed the plane's pilot Capt. I. R. Spong, flying blind through heavy snow clouds, could have read his instruments backwards.

Rescuers who braved the treacherous 500 foot peak to retrieve the remains of the victims said there was nothing left of the instruments except a mass of tangled wires.

Tiny fragments of the wreckage were strewn about a five mile area.

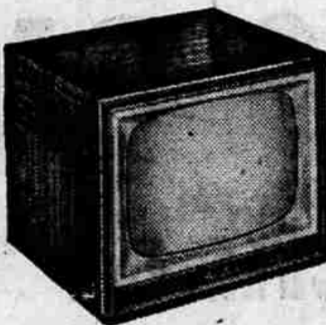

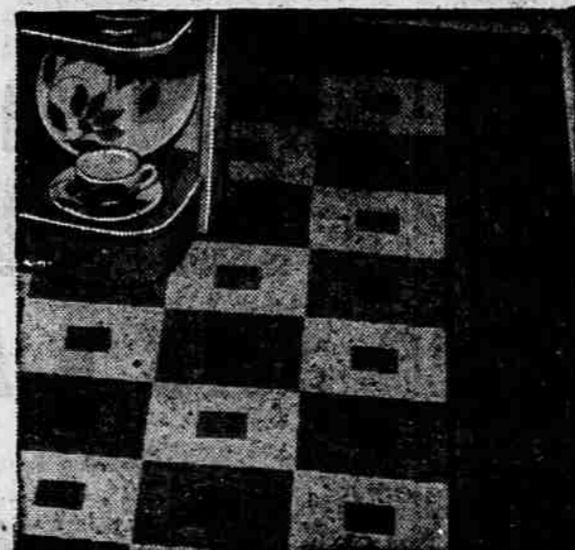
