Aggressor's Way Declared Harder

Bangkok, Thailand—(U.P.) Secretary of State John Foster Dulles told the final session of the Southeast Asia treaty nations Friday "the way of the aggressor has been made harder" by SEATO's urgent efforts to bring peace to Asia.

Decisions reached at the first meeting of the council under the Manila pact have given it an effective foundation to build defense against open armed aggression, defense against subversion and to promote economic and social well being, Dulles said.

The three-day conference adjourned after issuing a communique which said staff planners have been instructed to meet in Manila in April "to initiate plans for implementation of certain aspects of the treaty."

Missing Logger Found Injured in Snowbank

Port Angeles, Wash.—(U.P.) James Cashman, 22, a Tacoma logger, was rescued Thursday from the snowbank where he had been with a fractured pelvis for nearly 22 hours in freezing temperatures.

Cashman was felling snags in the burned area of the 1951 Forks fire on the Olympic peninsula when a snap bounced back and knocked him down. His brother, Ernest, became worried when James didn't return Wednesday night, and organized a search party.

ANOXIA AND PHYSICAL DEGENERATION

Anoxia—Without oxygen, insufficient supply of oxygen to cells, tissues, organs.

I'm concerned about physical degeneration. I awoke with a stiff neck and I couldn't get up the courage to do my morning rolls. Likewise this morning. But my neck is not so stiff now and I'll roll tomorrow, by golly.

Inadequate daily intake of calcium, phosphorus, iodine, vitamin B1 (thiamine), vitamin B2 (riboflavin) and vitamin D, from early childhood through breakfast this morning, is in my opinion the chief cause of premature physical degeneration.

Physical degeneration is manifest in some instances as cardiovascular degeneration (heart and artery wearing out), as you may learn by studying Little Lesson No. 2, the booklet C. V. D. for which send 25c and stamped self-addressed envelope.

In a pamphlet titled Young Folks and Old Folks I suggest how the former can avoid being mistaken from the latter and, within reasonable limitations, vice versa. This pamphlet, like dozens of others, is free, if you ask for it by title and provide stamped, self-addressed envelope. Social Security Data Booklet Mailed Out

Social security for farm families, how it works and what farmers need to do about it, are explained in a booklet just issued under the joint sponsorship of the Internal Revenue service and the Social Security administration.

It is now being mailed to every rural and star route boxholder in Oregon, it was announced Saturday by Walter V. Nussbaum, district manager of the social security office at Medford and Ralph C. Grandquist, district director of the Internal Revenue service for Oregon.

The booklet is directed to the self-employed farmer, farm employers, and farm workers—approximately 5 1/2 million in all—who were brought under social security on Jan. 1. The purpose of the publication is to acquaint them with their benefits and tax obligations under the old-age and survivors insurance program.

The mailing to rural boxholders in this area is part of a nationwide distribution to farm people. Those farmers who do not receive a copy through this mailing may obtain one from the District Director of Internal Revenue or from the nearest social security office.

The oxygen deficiency (anoxia) which I believe is as common a factor of physical degeneration as the vitamin and mineral deficiencies already mentioned attributable to shallow breathing habit. Shallow breathing is characteristic of civilized people as compared with the natural (belly or bellows) breathing of untutored or savage people.

Civilized people have been taught how to breathe by self-constituted experts or instructors who were ignorant of psychology. That's why most people think that one pushes out the chest and pulls in the belly in order to breathe deeply. The pouter pigeon, tin soldier caricature.

For the space of a minute or two it is possible to change one's breathing from ordinary shallow chesty breathing to natural, deep belly or bellows breathing, but as soon as attention is distracted from breathing it reverts to the shallow type.

I believe, however, that regular practice of the B.B. exercise (belly or bellows breathing), tends to prevent the anoxia due to our shallow breathing habit and so to retard the progress of physical degeneration. Instructions for the exercise are given in the pamphlet *Belly Breathing*, which is free if you provide stamped, self-addressed envelope.
